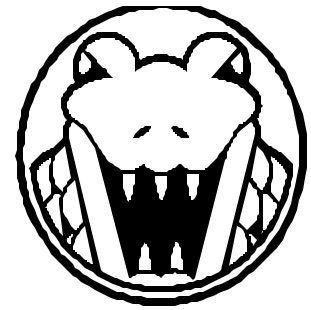

Fireside Trips

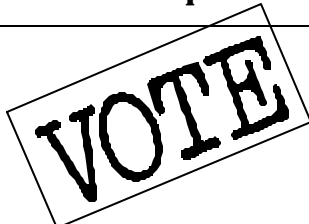
Intermediate Backpacking - November 10-12, 2000

- The Child Survival Site - which donates Vitamin A to prevent blindness and other health risks associated with Vitamin A deficiency in children.
- The Breast Cancer Site - the newest of the "Good Works" sites, which provides free mamograms for underprivileged women in the U.S.

What's up with Thanksgiving Break Closing in Alexander

If you are hoping to...

CHANGE ROOMS IN ALEXANDER:

The In-Hall Room change process will take place on **Wednesday 11/29 at 9pm** in the 1st floor lounge. After 11/8, stop by the staff office (Alexander 117) and pick up a **Room Change Form**. This form needs to be completed and returned to George by **Tuesday 11/28**. Priority for available spaces will be given out based on a point system (See the Room Change Form for more info)

MOVE TO ANOTHER HALL ON CAMPUS:

Call Housing (2-2120) as soon as possible to make an appointment for **December 6th or 7th**. A Housing staff member will work with you personally to try to identify a space. If you are planning to be "pulled-in" by a friend in another hall, you must attend her/his in-hall Process.

MOVE TO AN ON-CAMPUS APARTMENT:

Contact Beth Harrison in Housing at 2-1754. Students 19 years of age or older are eligible for the Gables and students 20 years of age or older are eligible for Woodside.

If you are...

GRADUATING, WITHDRAWING, STUDYING ABROAD, OR MOVING TO A GREEK HOUSE:

Submit a petition requesting a release from your Room and Board Agreement no later than **Monday, November 13**. The petition is available at Pettee House or it can also be downloaded at www.unh.edu/housing/forms.htm

If you...

WISH TO TERMINATE YOUR ROOM AND BOARD AGREEMENT FOR ANOTHER REASON:

You must submit a petition clearly stating your reason for requesting an early release. Please provide any supporting documentation. All information must be returned to Pettee House by **Monday, November 13th**.

As much as we would like to celebrate Turkey Days with all of you, the Alexander Hall Staff asks that you do everything you can to head home for Thanksgiving before **7:00pm on Wednesday November 22nd**. If you have not departed by 7:00pm we will ask you to come down and wait in the lounge so that staff members may depart for their own homes as early as possible.

Before you leave, please close and lock your windows and make sure your radiator is left on low. This will help keep pipes from freezing and bursting during the break. Hall staff will be entering rooms on the 22nd to make sure these tasks have been completed. (Be aware that RA's are obligated to document any policy violations that are in plain site).

During Thanksgiving Break, you will not be allowed back into Alexander for any reason. Your access card will be inactive from 7pm on 11/22 until 1pm on 11/26 so be sure you have everything you need before you leave. If you have any questions, feel free to contact any staff member.
