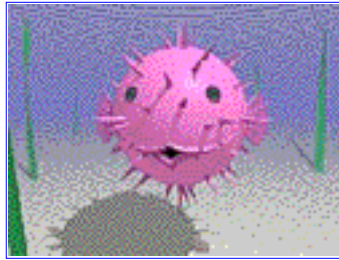
The A or anchor tag is used both for links to other documents and links to graphics. The link is displayed in the current window by default, but a new window can be opened with use of the optional TARGET attribute. Here are some examples -- View Source with your browser to see the HTML details.

Now it gets trickier. An inline image is used as a hyperlink to another image. Click on this thumbnail blowfish (made with the browser-safe

216-color palette) for a link to a



posterized

version of the blowfish that is reduced to just 16 colors. Set the BORDER attribute equal to zero (BORDER="0") on the IMG tag if you don't want a colored link border to appear around the image, though at the risk of making it less obvious that the image is a clickable link.
