**September 26** - The full committee met to continue updates and discussions from Spring 2006 about the self-study for NCAA certification, and to prepare for the October visit of the review committee. **November 28** – The full committee met to “debrief” the NCAA team visit and preliminary report. The committee also began to organize into the following subcommittees in order to monitor progress on the action plans in the NCAA self-study:

**February 27** – All Committee members attended except Ann Morgan and Tony Tagliaferro. John Dana and Rene Kleszczynski (UNH Sport Medicine) also attended. The meeting focused on a proposed new drug-testing/education policy for athletes, which had been distributed electronically prior to the meeting. Committee members requested some expansion in the education program and also that Athletics provide the AAC with an annual report, with details on both the education, testing, and enforcement aspects of the policy. There was no other business.

**March 27** – The following members were in attendance: Gugliuzza, Wood, Sorrentino, Ward, Sohl, Barber, Mitchell, Wolf, Hardy. Members Hoskin and Winters had given their proxies to Hardy. Steve Metcalf and Rene Kleszczynski attended from Athletics. In advance of the meeting Steve Metcalf had electronically circulated a revised draft of the new drug-testing/education policy. Committee members discussed the draft and determined that it met their earlier concerns. Rene Kleszczynski would have overall management of the policy. The committee voted to approve the new policy.
