

**Study Abroad in Lancaster, England  
UNH Exchange Program**

**The Program:** The Lancaster exchange offers UNH students the opportunity to study for a semester or an entire academic year in England in the progressive city of Lancaster. Located on the picturesque west coast of England, Lancaster University is one of the leading research institutions in the entire United Kingdom. In a recent government study it received a grade of 5 out of 5 in a number of departments, from sciences and engineering, to business/economics, to liberal arts. UNH students take courses alongside their English counterparts and other international students representing over one hundred countries. In general, UNH students can enroll in any course offered at the university. Lancaster also gives students the opportunity to do independent study projects for credit as well—one of the few institutions in the UK that offers this option. The university boasts over one hundred clubs, sporting teams, and art societies, which all foreign students are eligible to join. There are a number of eateries and pubs on campus in which to dine or relax as well.

**The City:** Within the city itself, there are a myriad of activities to keep one busy. Whether wandering the winding medieval streets, shopping for the latest trends at any of the numerous boutiques, or exploring some of the city's fifty historic pubs, there is always something to do. Lancaster is also home to the Duke's Playhouse, numerous outdoor music concerts, and a number of large festivals, including the famous literary festival held every October.

**Location:** Lancaster is a great base from which to explore the UK, as well as the rest of Europe. The city is just four miles from the Irish Sea and just an hour south of the much celebrated Lake District—a British gem for hikers, campers, outdoor enthusiasts, and admirers of unspoiled natural beauty. London, Glasgow, and Edinburgh are less than three hours away by train. The ferry port to Dublin or Belfast is less than two hours away. The cosmopolitan city of Manchester can be reached in about an hour and provides inexpensive plane travel to the rest of Europe from its international airport.

**Accommodation:** Students are guaranteed housing on campus in a residential college living among both English and international students. In general, most rooms are singles with a shared lounge and kitchen area. There is no meal plan, but there is an abundance of inexpensive meal options, both on and off campus.

**Tuition and fees :** As part of the exchange agreement, UNH students pay their normal UNH tuition and fees. The student pays Lancaster directly for housing. See estimated costs for the exchange on the reverse.
