The Plan of Study (POS) is unique for each student. It is a guide to follow in completing all graduation requirements. Students should make an appointment to meet with their academic advisor and CIE advisor to update their plans of study. We want to ensure that all students complete their program of study in a timely manner. All future requirements on the POS should be made in pencil. The POS should be used when making course selections during pre-registration and a copy should be taken abroad when completing the course registration on line.

## University Academic Requirements

To graduate from the University of New Hampshire, baccalaureate and associate in arts students must fulfill four types of University requirements: writing, general education, degree, and major.

## Writing-Intensive Courses

All bachelor's degree candidates are required to complete four "writing-intensive" courses, which must include English 401 (Freshman Composition) and three additional "writing-intensive" courses, one of which must be in the student's major, and one of which must be at the 600-level or above. ## General Education

There are 10 General Education requirements, designated by group number. You are required to take 3 courses in group 3 in at least 2 different sub-groups. It is your responsibility to verify with the Registrar's Office that you have satisfied all Gen Ed requirements. You can do this by requesting a degree audit at the Registrar's Office. ## Degree Requirement

1. At least 128 credits in courses numbered 200-799 (courses numbered 400-799 for B.S.), with a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 for all courses taken at the University in which a grade is given. A minimum 2.5 GPA and 32 credit hours are required by the time of your Study abroad experience.
2. Completion of the University general education requirements.
3. For B.A. candidates, proficiency in a foreign language at the level achieved by satisfactory work in a one-year, college-level course.

## Major Courses:

Major courses required for completion of your disciplinary major. It is your responsibility to meet with your major advisor and verify that the POS reflects the correct number and sequence of major courses. You are responsible for making sure that you satisfy all major requirements
