Shadi Atallah teaches ecological-economic modeling and forest economics in the College of Life Sciences and Agriculture. His primary research focuses on the bio-economics of managing pests, diseases, and invasive plants, with applications in agriculture, forestry, and agroforestry. Atallah's secondary research interest is in the economics of localizing food supply chains.

Among Atallah's recent publications are articles in *Land Economics*, *American Journal of Agricultural Economics*, *Food Policy*, and the *American Journal of Enology and Viticulture*. He received his Ph.D. in Applied Economics from Cornell University, his MS in Agricultural and Resource Economics from UC Davis as well as a MS in Plant Science from the American University of Beirut.
