PROJECT UPDATES: SUMMER 2012



Green Mountain Communications, Inc., vendor for New NHSafeNet, has completed exterior

construction on 17 of 20 sites that will consolidate high speed microwave broadband traffic among five New Hampshire agencies and departments. Construction on Mt Washington in June was delayed by SNOW! The network will also have interoperability with public safety in Maine and Massachusetts.

New Hampshire Optical Systems has received licenses on 70% of the utility poles that will eventually connect 700 miles of next generation fiber optic network cable in New Hampshire. Construction of 140 miles of fiber has been completed as of August. NHOS has prepared fiber to be connected to 26 NH Colleges that will be serviced by the University System of New Hampshire's educational and research network called IBEAM.

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation commenced construction of 20 miles of fiber for their Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) on June 26, 2012.

This section of construction is currently 30% complete. The new fiber will expand the ability to communicate messages on the highway between the Traffic Management Center in Concord and highway signs on I-293, I-93, I-89, Rt 101, and the Everett Turnpike.



New Hampshire FastRoads secured \$1.25 million dollars in match funding in July and has completed pole licensing applications for the network in Western New Hampshire.

In addition to connecting many schools, libraries, municipal buildings, health care facilities, and public safety buildings, FastRoads will be piloting Fiber to the Home (FTTH) in the communities of Enfield and Rindge.
