## COURSE LIMITATIONS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

- ARTS:** Space in studio courses is extremely limited.
- BIOCHEMISTRY:** 658/659 General Biochemistry and lab: very limited enrollment
- BIOLOGY:** 411-412 Principles of Biology: extremely limited                      541 General Ecology: closed  
604 Principles of Genetics: extremely limited  
605 Eukaryotic Cell and Developmental Biology: extremely limited
- BUSINESS & RELATED MAJORS** **Home campus must be AACSB accredited.** Upper division courses in the following majors are **closed** to exchange students: Accounting & Finance, Business Administration, Decision Sciences, Economics, Hospitality Management, Management, and Marketing. Access to lower division courses in these majors is very limited. Transcript must be provided prior to registration.
- CHEMISTRY:** 403, 404, 405 General Chemistry (for Engineering majors): extremely limited space  
545/546: Organic Chemistry extremely limited space;  
547/548, 549/550, 651/652, 653/654 & Organic Chemistry classes/labs: closed
- COMMUNICATION:** Upper division courses closed, lower division very limited. 400-500 level is very limited.
- EDUCATION:** EDUC 500 Exploring Teaching: closed. **Note:** You must take the equivalent of this course at your home campus before taking any 700 level education course at UNH. You must petition to prove this equivalency prior to UNH registration.
- ENGLISH:** All 400- and 500-level English courses are available. We recommend (but do not require) that students have taken a literary analysis course at home institution (i.e., a UNH ENGL 419 equivalent) with a C or better as the appropriate preparation for 600-level literature courses. We require that students have taken a literary analysis course with C or better at home institution, or have taken several upper-level literature courses, in order to register for 700-level literature courses. All 600- and 700-level permission-required writing courses are closed (621, 622, 623, 625/626, 627/628, 701, 703/704, 707, 708, 709, 711, 721, 722, 723) as are internship and independent study courses (620, 720, 795).
- GEOGRAPHY:** Upper division courses are very limited.
- INTERNSHIPS, PRACTICA, & INDEPENDENT STUDY:** closed
- KINESIOLOGY:** Outdoor Education upper-level courses closed
- MICROBIOLOGY:** 503 General Microbiology: closed  
713/15 Microbes and the Environment and associated lab: very limited space
- NATURAL RESOURCES:** 401 Natural Resources Perspectives: closed                      775 NR Senior Project: closed
- PHYSICS:** 401/402 Intro to Physics I&II: limited space 407/408 General Physics I & II: limited space
- PSYCHOLOGY:** 700-level classes: limited enrollment & major restricted. Intro Psychology, Research Methods, and Psychology Stats are prerequisites to all upper-level courses.

**SOCIAL WORK:** Upper-level courses open only to majors from an accredited Social Work program.

**SOCIOLOGY:** SOC 599 and 601 are major restricted and restricted to juniors and seniors only.  
SOC 599 is a prerequisite for all 600-700 level courses.  
SOC 595, 699, 776 require permission.

**ZOOLOGY:** 503 Intro to Marine Biology: closed 507/508 Human Anatomy & Physiology: limited  
625/626 Principles of Animal Physiology: very limited  
690 Evolution: closed
