Certain sponsors limit the number of proposals submitted by each university, requiring an internal selection process. What are those opportunities, and how do we decide who gets to apply?

There are a goodly number of these limited-application programs. Lynnette Hentges from OSR has compiled two initial lists, federal and other, which can be found on the websites listed below. If you know of others, we'd be happy to add them. You might find some interesting possibilities on these lists.

The on-campus selection process has not always been transparent, but we will try to make it more so. Strategically, the university wants to support proposals that: 1) involve a number of faculty from different departments or colleges, 2) have the best chances for success, and 3) provide resources that can be used for the general good of the institution. I will consult with the Research Advisory Board (faculty from across campus) in deciding which proposals will go forward. If you want to submit to one of these opportunities, **please let us know at least 2 months before the deadline**, and certainly before you put in the tremendous amount of work required to write the proposal.

We will continue to send announcements of particular programs to Deans and Chairs.
