**Sample Size:** 524 randomly selected former Massachusetts residents.

Potential respondents for this survey were randomly drawn from the Experian (Lincoln, NE) “New Movers” database. The database was compiled from change of address from utilities, telephone companies, public records, and other commercial databases. It does not contain the names of all households who moved out of MA. Potential respondents were defined as households who had moved out of Massachusetts between March 2005 and March, 2006.

**Sampling Error:** +/- 4.4%

**Response Rate (AAPOR #4):** 36.4%
