

SUNUNU PULLS AWAY FROM SMITH IN RACE FOR U.S. SENATE

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UNH Survey Center
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DURHAM, NH -- Republican Congressman John Sununu has widened his lead over incumbent Bob Smith in the GOP primary race and continues to enjoy a slim lead over Democratic Governor Jeanne Shaheen.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Six hundred ninety-four (694) New Hampshire adults were interviewed between April 10 and April 18, 2002 (margin of sampling error, +/-3.7 percent). Included in this sample were 506 registered voters (margin of sampling error, +/-4.4 percent), and 526 likely voters in the 2002 election (margin of sampling error, +/-4.3 percent). U.S. SENATE

The race for the U.S. Senate seat from New Hampshire is one of the most hotly contested in the nation. Two-term incumbent Republican Bob Smith of Wolfeboro is being challenged by fellow Republican John Sununu of Bedford, a three-term Representative from New Hampshire's 1st District. Support for Sununu has grown significantly over the past three months and he now enjoys a wide lead over Smith. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 59 percent of likely GOP primary voters saying they plan to vote for Sununu, 30 percent plan to vote for Smith, 2 percent favor some other candidate, and 10 percent are undecided. Sununu's lead has increased since February when he led Smith 51 percent to 37 percent. "Sununu has managed to gain considerable support among Republicans without 'going negative' on Smith" said Andrew Smith, the Director of the UNH Survey Center. "Sununu appears to have the best chance at defeating Jeanne Shaheen in November. The next two months will be critical for the Smith campaign to maintain their fundraising base, both in New Hampshire and Washington."

Three-term Governor Jeanne Shaheen of Madbury is unchallenged for the Democratic nomination and will present either Smith or Sununu with a significant challenge in November. Sununu continues to run stronger than Smith against Shaheen. Currently, 50 percent of likely November election voters favor Sununu, 42 percent favor Shaheen, 2 percent favor some other candidate, and 6 percent are undecided. Sununu's lead has been stable since the February Granite State Poll. In a hypothetical race between Smith and Shaheen in November, Shaheen is leading Smith among likely voters 49 percent to 42 percent, with 5 percent favoring some other candidate, and only 5 percent are undecided. Shaheen has widened her lead over Smith since February when it stood at 46 percent to 43 percent for Smith.

SENATE FAVORABILITY RATINGS

John Sununu is leading in the race for U.S. Senate, in part, because he has the highest favorability ratings of the three Senate candidates. Among registered voters, 55 percent have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 28 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 8 percent are neutral, and 9 percent don't know enough about him to say. Sununu's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion of him minus those having an unfavorable opinion, is +27 percent, although it has dropped considerably from +47 percent in the October Granite State Poll. Bob Smith's favorability ratings are considerably lower than Sununu's with only 40 percent of New Hampshire registered voters saying they have a favorable opinion of Smith, 37 percent having an unfavorable opinion, 11 percent are neutral, and 12 percent not knowing enough about him to say. Smith's net favorability rating is down to only +3 percent, down from +20 percent in February. Jeanne Shaheen's favorability ratings are approximately the same as Sununu's with 57 percent having a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 32 percent having an unfavorable opinion of her, 9 percent are neutral, and 2 percent don't know enough to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating is +25 percent, up from +20 percent in February.

NH GOVERNOR

The race for New Hampshire Governor is in much greater flux than the Senate race because the candidates vying for both the Republican and Democratic nomination are less well known to NH voters than are the U.S. Senate candidates.

There have been several shakeups in the race for the Republican gubernatorial nomination since February. David Corbin has withdrawn from the race and the extensive advertising campaign by former Cabletron founder Craig Benson is bearing fruit and he has pulled ahead of former U.S. Senator Gordon Humphrey. In the latest Granite State Poll, 37 percent of likely Republican primary voters plan to vote for Benson, 27 percent plan to vote for Humphrey, 8 percent favor former State Senator Bruce Keough, 10 percent favor some other candidate, and 18 percent are undecided. Support for Benson jumped from 20 percent in February while Humphrey lost 10 percent over the same period. Support for Keough has been essentially unchanged.

Benson's net favorability rating is currently +10 percent, up from +3 percent in the February Granite State Poll. Humphrey has a net favorability rating of +8, down from +13 percent in February and +16 percent in October. Keough is still largely unknown to NH voters with 77 percent saying they don't know enough about him to have an opinion. His net favorability rating stands at +2 percent.

Among Democrats, State Senator Bev Hollingworth of Hampton and State Senator Mark Fernald of Sharon continue to jostle for the lead with former Executive Councilor Jim Normand of Manchester in third. Currently, 23 percent of likely Democratic primary voters say they plan to vote for Hollingworth, 16 percent plan to vote for Fernald, 8 percent favor Normand, 10 percent favor some other candidate, and 44 percent remain undecided. (Caution must be used when interpreting these figures as sample sizes for the likely primary voter sub-samples are small.)

There are a high percentage of undecided voters because the candidates are still largely unknown to New Hampshire voters. Sixty-five percent of registered voters say they don't know enough about Fernald to have an opinion about him, 69 percent don't know enough about Hollingworth to form an opinion, and 81 percent don't know enough about Normand to form an opinion. The net favorability ratings of the Democratic gubernatorial candidates are +15 percent for Hollingworth, +8 percent for Fernald and +2 percent for Normand, essentially unchanged since February.

SUB-GROUP ANALYSIS

Sununu is pulling away from Smith in part because he has the support of the Republican party base. Among registered Republicans, Sununu leads Smith by an astounding 72 percent to 21 percent. And in trial heat match-ups versus Shaheen, Sununu also does better than Smith among registered Republicans (78% to 63%), conservatives (75% to 70%), self-identified Republicans (79% to 68%) and among undeclared voters (46% to 38%). Shaheen gets her strongest support from Democrats and liberals and voters earning between \$60,000 and \$75,000.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from April 10 to April 18, 2002. A random sample of 694 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 3.7 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population. The margin of sampling error for likely November voters (N=526) is +/-4.3 percent. The margin of sampling error for registered voters (N=506) is +/-4.4 percent. The margin of sampling error for likely GOP primary voters (N=237) is +/-6.4 percent. The margin of sampling error for likely Democrat primary voters (N=172) is +/-7.5 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and for region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
