BUSH APPROVAL RATINGS REMAIN LOW

DURHAM, NH – President Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire have not recovered despite improvements in the U.S. economy. The conflict in Iraq continues to hold down Bush’s overall ratings as well as views about his handling of the economy.

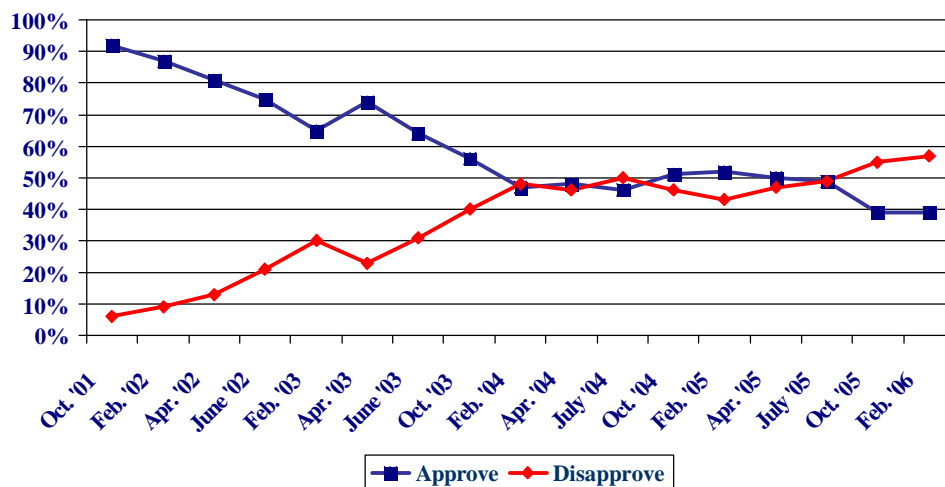
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,[?] conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred six (506) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between February 10 and February 17, 2006. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent.

Presidential Approval

President George W. Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire have remained at low levels despite continuous improvements in the U.S. economy. Bush was recently in New Hampshire to rally support for the legislative plan he outlined in his State of the Union Address but this has not improved how people view his administration. In the most recent Granite State Poll, only 39 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Bush is doing as president, 57 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral. Approval of Bush as president has remained unchanged since the Fall, 2005 Granite State Poll. “People in New Hampshire remained amazingly split along party lines,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “Republicans continue to think Bush is doing a fine job while Democrats strongly disapprove. The political problem for the Bush Administration is that 3 in 5 independents now disapprove of the job Bush is doing.” Seventy-nine percent of Republicans approve of the job Bush is doing as President while 91 percent of Democrats and 58 percent of Independents disapprove of the job Bush is doing.

Bush’s personal favorability rating also remains. Currently, only 41 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Bush, 53 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6 percent are neutral. Bush’s net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is -12%, down from +6% in July and the lowest of his presidency. Currently, 81 percent of Republicans have a favorable opinion of Bush, down from 91 percent in July while 85 percent of Democrats have an unfavorable opinion of him.

Presidential Approval – G.W. Bush

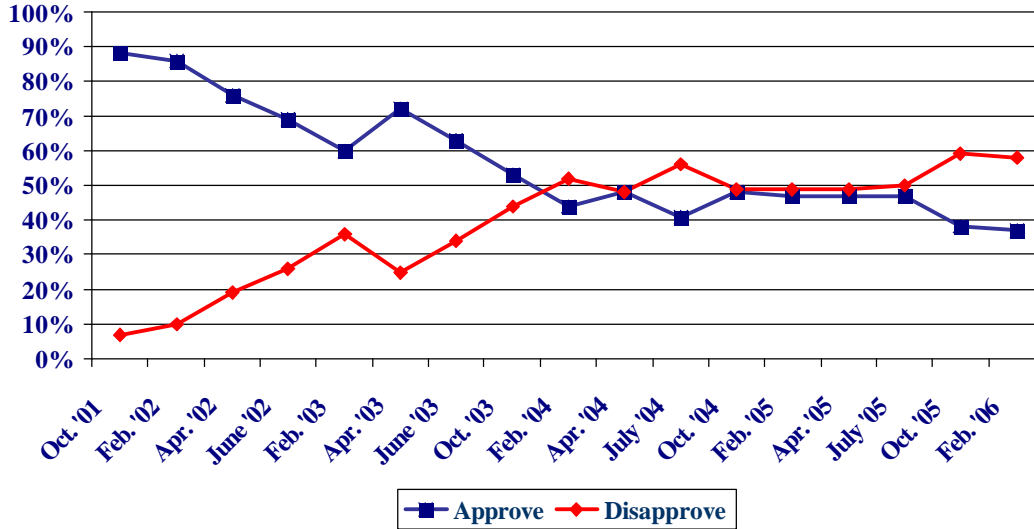

Foreign Affairs

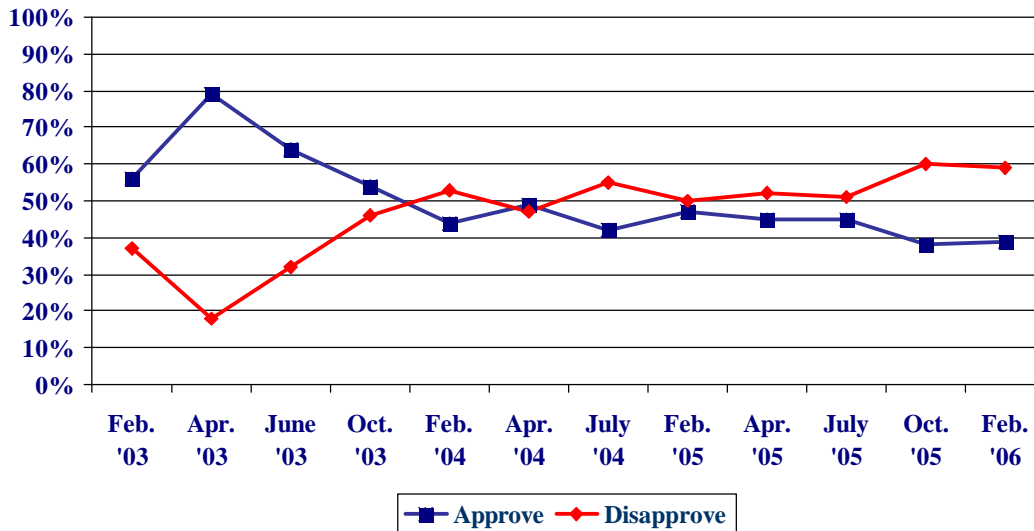
Bush's low ratings in New Hampshire are tied to the continuing problems faced in Iraq and perceptions that his administration is not successfully handling the situation there. When asked about how the president is handling foreign affairs, only 37 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve, 58 percent disapprove, and 5 percent are neutral. These percentages are unchanged since the Fall, 2005 Granite State Poll.

Turning specifically to Iraq, only 39 percent of Granite State adults approve of the way Bush has handled the situation there, 59 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral. This measure is also unchanged since Fall, 2005.

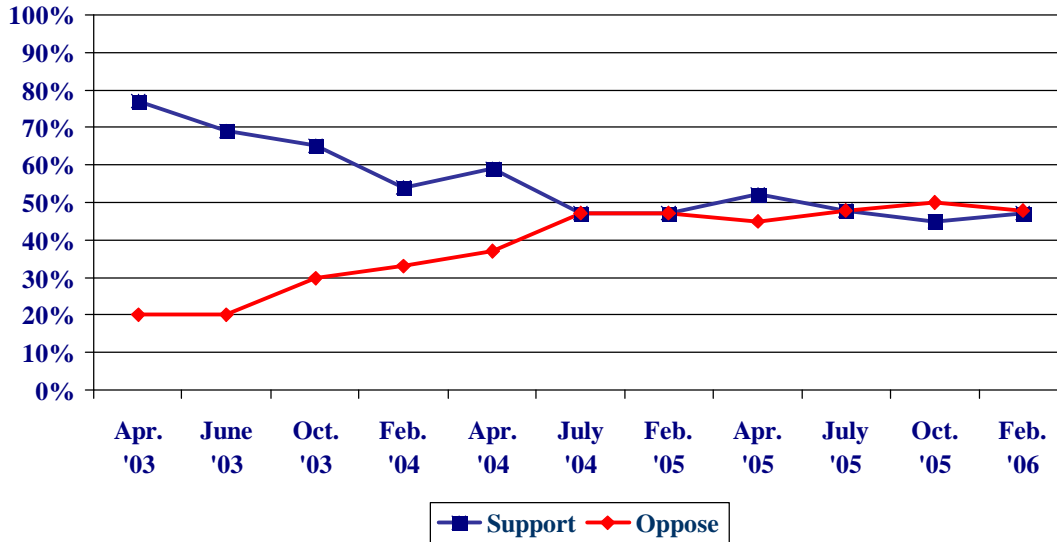
Bush Approval: Handling Situation In Iraq



Support for the U.S. having gone to war with Iraq has stabilized. Currently, 47 percent support the U.S. having gone to war in Iraq, 48 percent oppose the U.S. having gone to war, and 5 percent are neutral. Support for the U.S. having gone to war with Iraq inched up slightly from 45 percent in Fall, 2005.

When asked what U.S. troops should do in Iraq, 55 percent think they should stay until the situation has stabilized, 39 percent think the troops should be brought home as soon as possible, and 6 percent don't know.

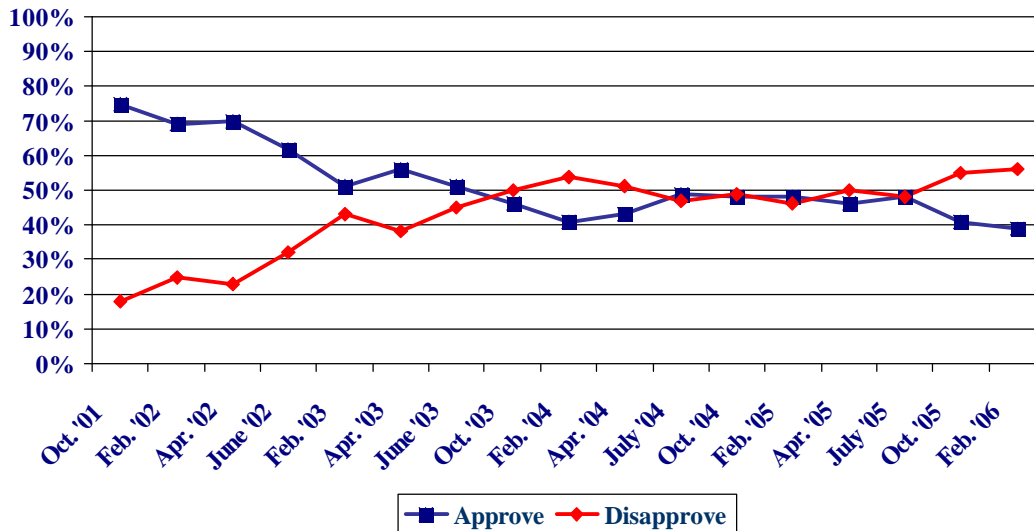
Support for War In Iraq



Economic Approval Rating

Even though the U.S. economy continues to grow at a steady pace, only 39 percent of New Hampshire residents say they approve of the job President Bush is doing handling the economy, 56 percent disapprove, and 5 percent are neutral. The percentage who approve of Bush's handling of the economy has dropped from 48 percent in July and is at the lowest level of his presidency.

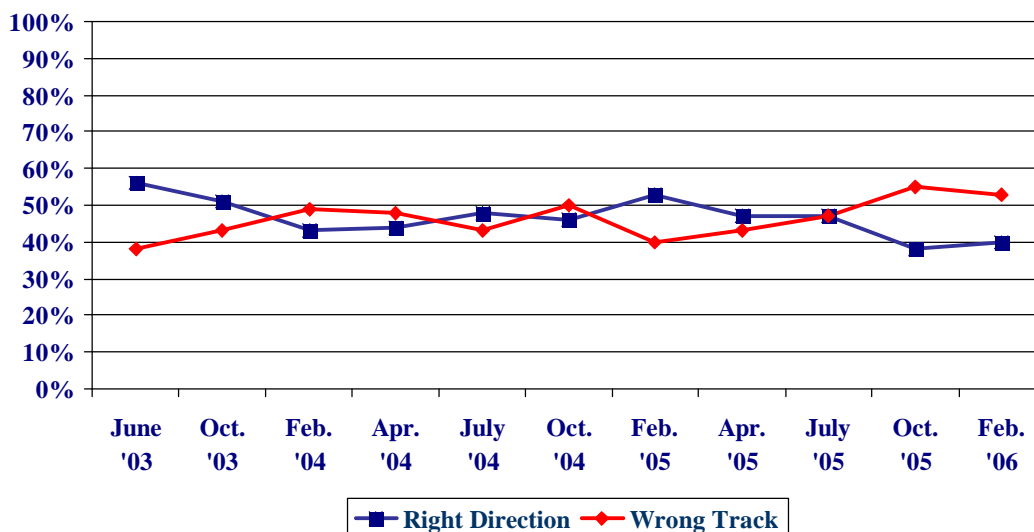
Bush Approval: Handling the Economy



Right Track – Wrong Track

New Hampshire residents are still concerned about the direction the U.S. is headed. Only 40 percent of New Hampshire residents think that things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 53 percent think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 7 percent don't know. This measure up slightly since Fall, 2005 but remains near its lowest level of the Bush presidency.

Subgroup Analysis

Bush continues to get his highest approval ratings from Republicans, conservatives, middle income residents (between \$60,000 and \$100,000 annually) and people who attend church weekly. Democrats, liberals, people who have moved to New Hampshire in the past 5 years, people who have never married, people who do not attend church, people with post-graduate educations, and residents of northern New Hampshire are most likely to give Bush low approval ratings.

Republicans, conservatives, young adults, and people earning between \$60,000 and \$100,000 are most supportive of the war in Iraq while Democrats, liberals, union households, those 50 and older, people with post-graduate educations, those who are divorced, low income residents (under \$30,000) and non-churchgoing residents are most opposed to the war in Iraq.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from February 10 to February 17, 2006. A random sample of 506 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.4 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
