### SHAHEEN STILL LEADS IN NH SENATE RACE

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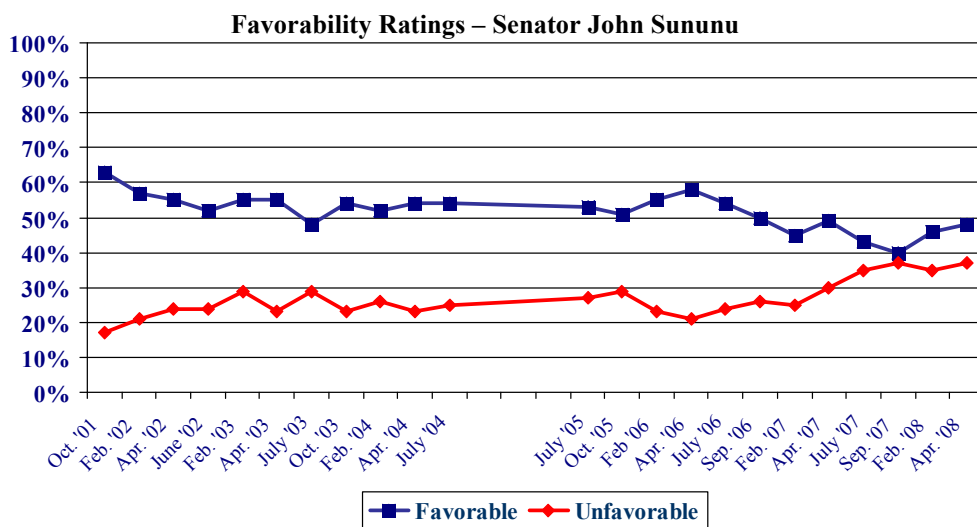

DURHAM, NH – Former Governor Jeanne Shaheen continues to hold a sizeable lead over incumbent Republican John Sununu in the race for the U.S. Senate in New Hampshire. In the 1st District, incumbent Carol Shea-Porter trails former Congressman Jeb Bradley but leads the other Republican challenger, John Stephen.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred (500) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between April 25 and April 30, 2008. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent. Two hundred forty-nine (249) respondents lived in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%) and 251 lived in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%).

#### John Sununu

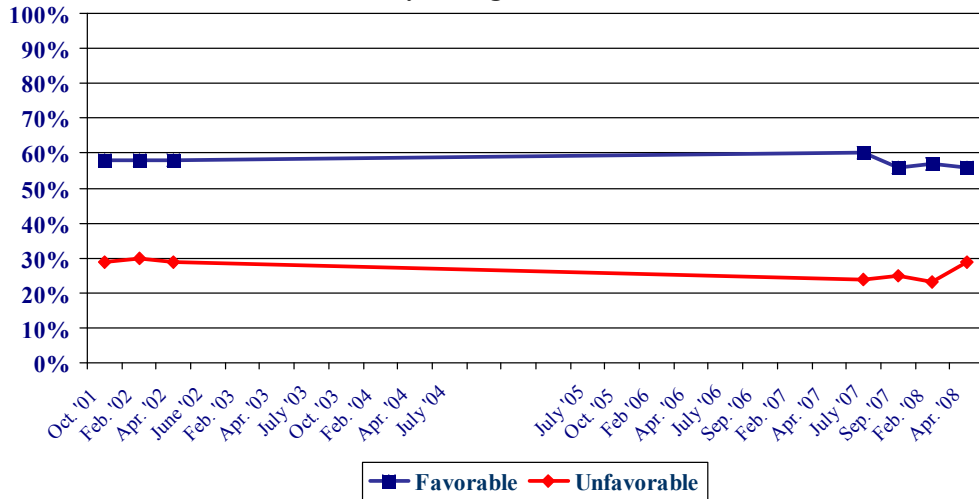
Republican Senator John Sununu is facing a rematch of his 2002 race with former Democratic Governor Jeanne Shaheen, who he defeated by a 51% to 46% margin. Sununu has trailed Shaheen significantly over the past year as Democrats have sought to tie him to the unpopular George W. Bush. And while he has closed the gap somewhat, Sununu must be considered the underdog going into the November election. Currently, Sununu is viewed favorably by 48% of New Hampshire adults, 37% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral and 4% don't know enough to say. Sununu's net favorability remains unchanged since February at +11%.



Shaheen was a popular Governor and remains popular today. Currently, 56% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 10% are neutral, and 5% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating is a solid +27%.

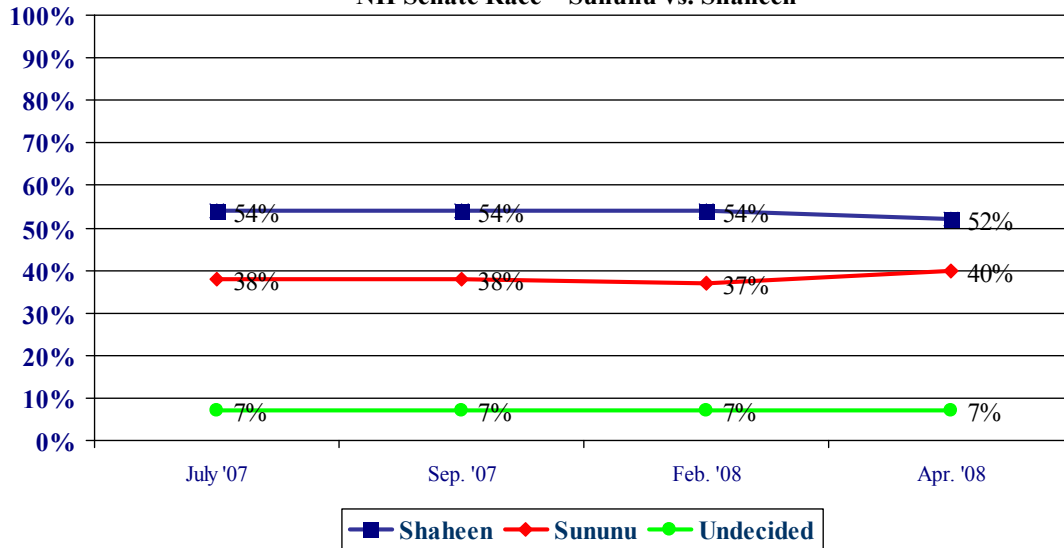
### Favorability Ratings – Jeanne Shaheen



### NH Senate Trial Heat

In a matchup between Sununu and Shaheen, the former New Hampshire governor receives 52% of the vote with 40% going to Sununu, 1% for some other candidate and only 7% are undecided. Sununu has narrowed the gap with Shaheen somewhat in recent months – he currently trails Shaheen by 12% but trailed by 17% in February. Shaheen runs strongest among Democrats, liberals, people with high levels of education, single adults, non-religious voters, and residents of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District, particularly those living in the Connecticut Valley. Sununu runs strongest among Republicans, conservatives, older voters and residents of the North Country and the Greater Manchester area.

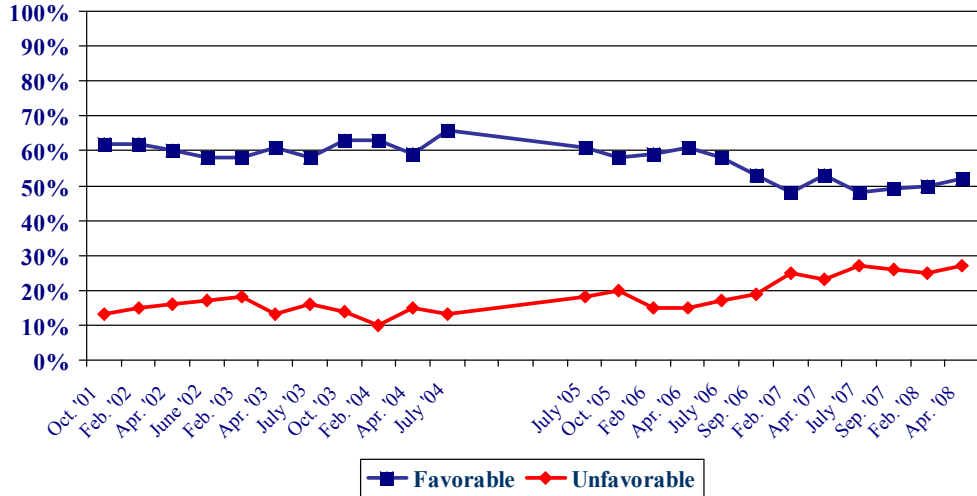
### NH Senate Race – Sununu vs. Shaheen



### Judd Gregg

Republican Senator Judd Gregg continues to be more popular than Sununu – 52% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Gregg, 27% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral and 10% don't know enough to say. Gregg's net favorability rating stands at +25 percent.

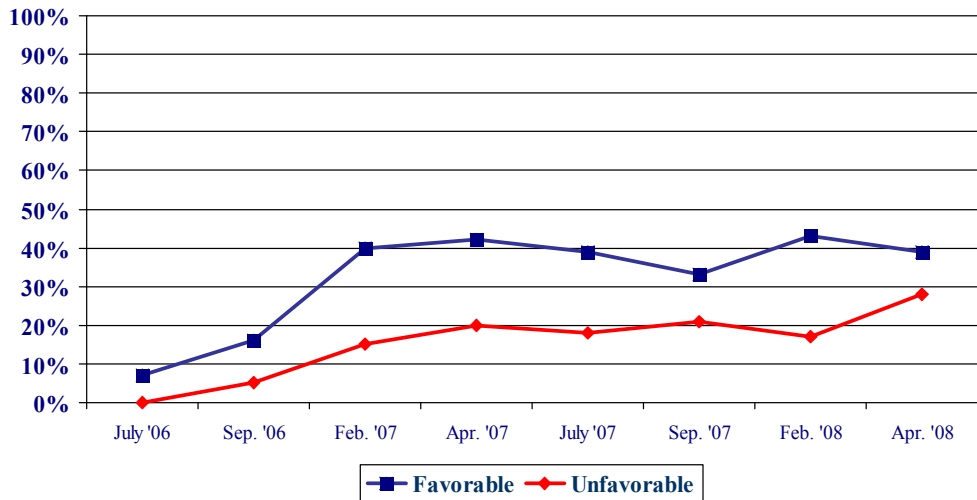
**Favorability Ratings – Senator Judd Gregg**



### NH 1<sup>st</sup> District

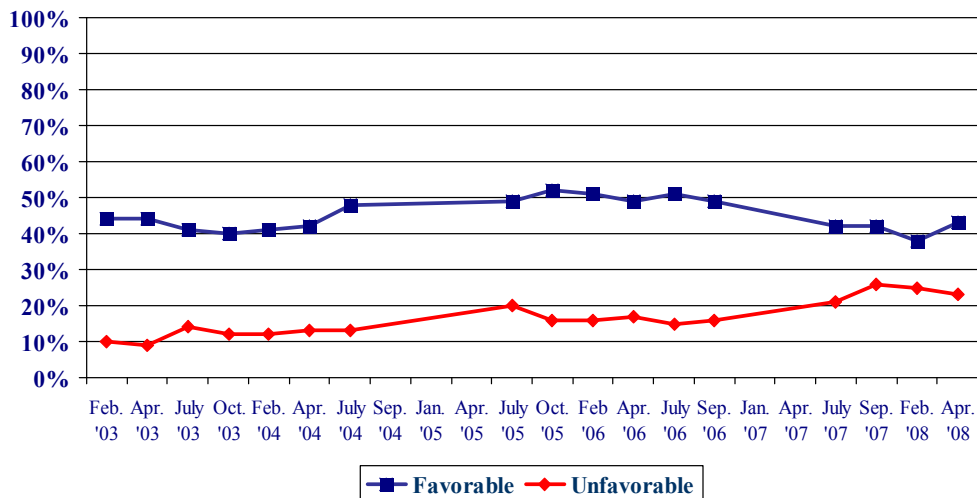
In New Hampshire's 1<sup>st</sup> Congressional District, Democrat Carol Shea-Porter is viewed favorably by 39% of 1<sup>st</sup> District adults, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 12% are neutral, and 21% say they don't know enough about her to say. Shea-Porter's net favorability rating is +11%, down significantly from +26% in February.

**Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1<sup>st</sup> District**



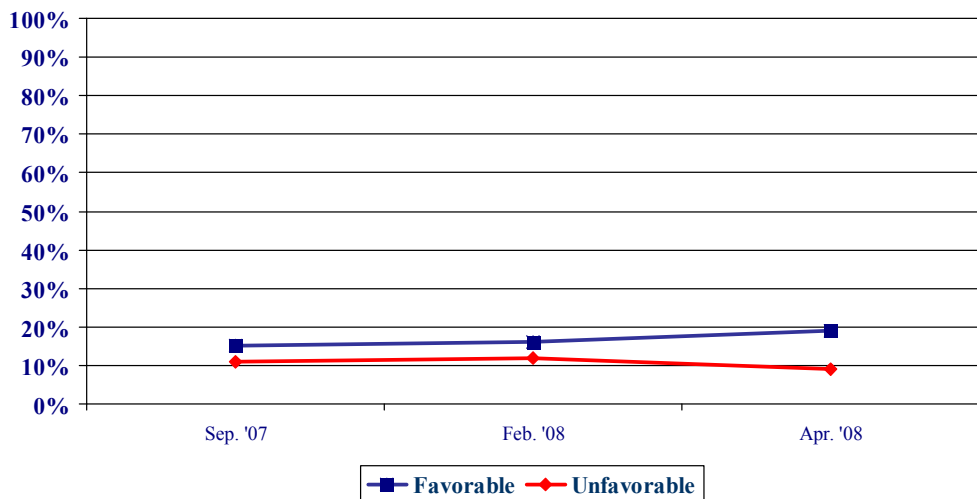
Former 1<sup>st</sup> District Congressman Jeb Bradley is running to regain the seat which he lost to Shea-Porter in 2006. Currently, 43% of 1<sup>st</sup> District voters have a favorable opinion of Bradley, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 19% are neutral and 16% don't know enough about him to say. Bradley's net favorability rating in the 1<sup>st</sup> District stands at +20%, up significantly from +13% in February.

Former Health and Human Services Commission John Stephen is also running for the 1<sup>st</sup> District seat and will challenge Bradley for the Republican nomination. Stephen remains considerably less well known than Bradley – only 19% of 1<sup>st</sup> District residents have a favorable opinion of Stephen, 9% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 13% are neutral, and 59% don't know enough about him to say. His net approval rating is only +10 percent.

### Favorability Ratings – John Stephen NH 1<sup>st</sup> District

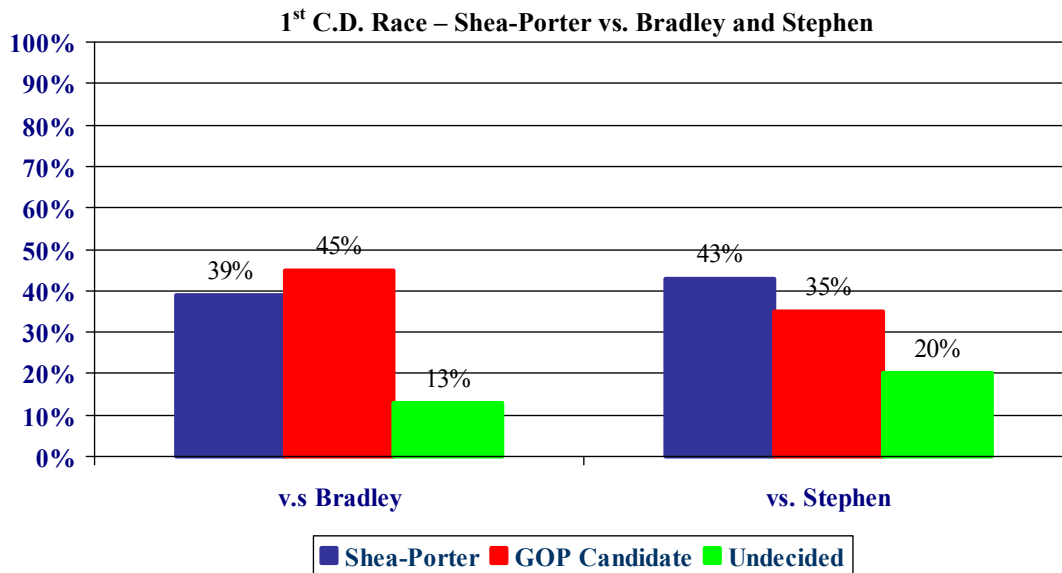


In trial heats between Shea-Porter and her two Republican challengers, Bradley fares considerably better than Stephen. In a matchup between Shea-Porter and Bradley, 45% of likely voters in the 1<sup>st</sup> District say they will vote for Bradley, 39% say they will vote for Shea-Porter, 2% prefer some other candidate and 13% are undecided.

Bradley runs strongest among Republicans, conservatives, older voters, regular church goers, New Hampshire natives and residents of Greater Manchester. Shea-Porter gets her strongest support from Democrats, liberals, and union households. While both Shea-Porter and Bradley hold most of their partisans, Bradley holds a 41% to 21% lead among 1<sup>st</sup> District independents.

But Shea-Porter does much better when matched against Stephen – 43% of 1<sup>st</sup> District likely voters say they would vote for Shea-Porter, 35% say they would vote for Stephen, 2% prefer some other candidate, and 20% are undecided.

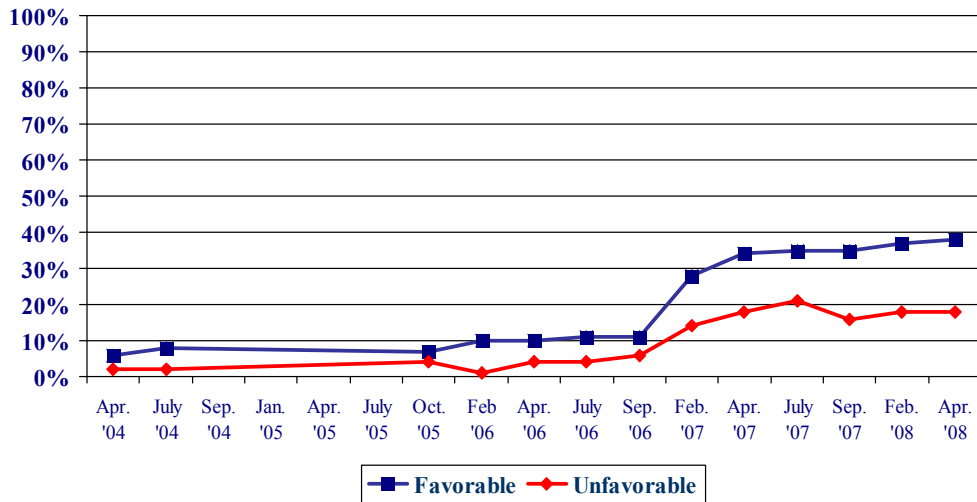
“Currently, Jeb Bradley is much better known than John Stephen and this is reflected in matchups with Carol Shea-Porter,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “Stephen faces a difficult challenge in getting 1<sup>st</sup> District voters to know who he is before he can convince voters, particularly Republicans, that he is the man to beat Shea-Porter.”



### NH 2<sup>nd</sup> District

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> District, incumbent Democrat Paul Hodes remains popular. Currently, 38% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District residents say they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 18% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 16% are neutral, and 27% say they know too little about him to say. Hodes' net favorability rating is +20 percent, unchanged since February.

**Favorability Ratings – Paul Hodes NH 2nd District**

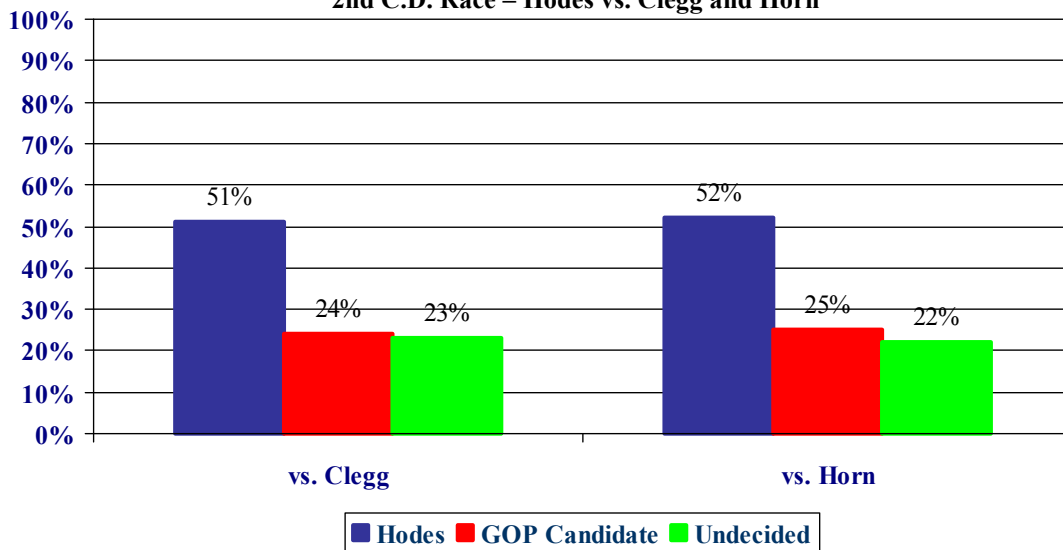


Several Republicans are contesting for the Republican nomination to face Hodes, the two who have raised the most money are Nashua journalist Jennifer Horn and State Senator Bob Clegg of Hudson. Both Clegg and Horn are largely unknown in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District. Only 10% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District residents have a favorable opinion of Clegg, 12% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 22% are neutral, and 57% don't know enough about him to say. Clegg's net favorability rating is -2%.

Similarly, only 7% of 2<sup>nd</sup> District adults have a favorable opinion of Horn, 2% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 14% are neutral, and 77% don't know enough about her to say. Horn's net favorability rating is +5%.

In part because he is viewed favorably by 2<sup>nd</sup> District voters, and because his challengers are largely unknown, Hodes currently holds comfortable leads over Clegg and Horn for the 2<sup>nd</sup> District seat. Hodes leads Clegg by a 51% to 24% margin, with 2% preferring some other candidate and 23% undecided and he leads Horn by a 52% to 25% margin, with 2% favoring some other candidate and 22% undecided.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred (500) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between April 25 and April 30, 2008. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent. Two hundred forty-nine (249) respondents lived in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%) and 251 lived in the 2<sup>nd</sup> District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%). Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
