### NH CONGRESSIONAL FAVORABILITY RATINGS

DURHAM, NH – The New Hampshire Congressional delegation has seen declines in their favorability ratings as economic troubles continue in New Hampshire. Looking ahead to 2010, Senator Judd Gregg and former Senator John Sununu, both of whom have not said they would run, lead Paul Hodes, the Democratic candidate for the U.S. Senate.

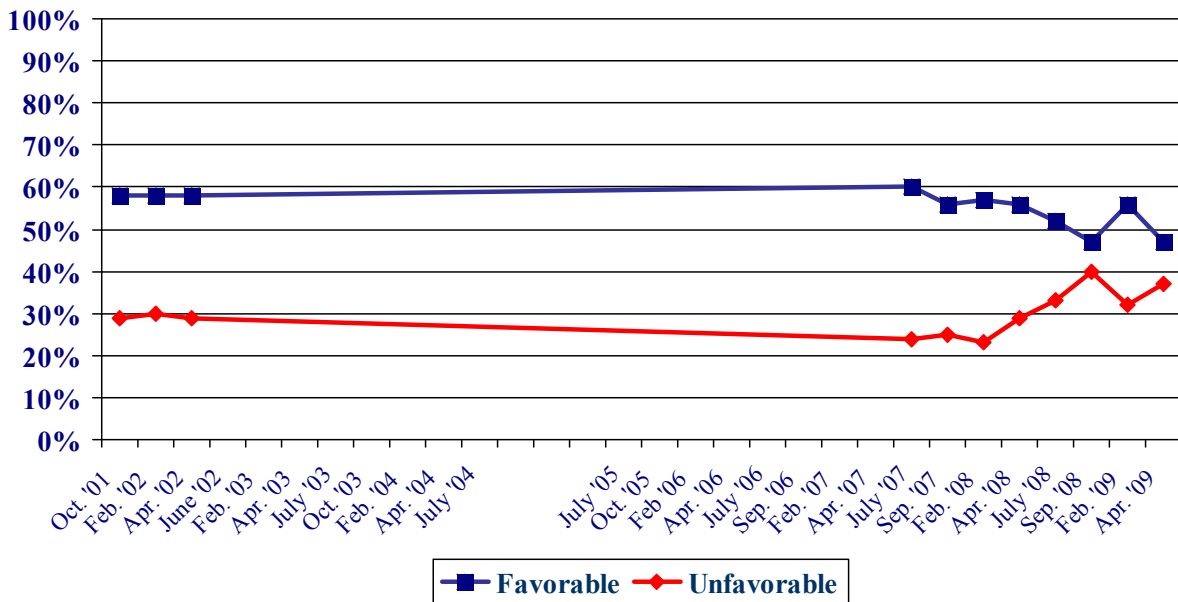
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and three (503) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between April 13 and April 22, 2009. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent. Included was a subsample of 261 adults in the NH First Congressional District (margin of sampling error +/- 6.1%) and a subsample of 238 adults in the NH Second Congressional District (margin of sampling error +/- 6.4%).

#### Favorability Ratings – Jeanne Shaheen

With the historic 2008 election in the past, many elected Democrats are seeing public support diminish somewhat as economic problems in New Hampshire and the country continue, seemingly unabated. Senator Jeanne Shaheen has seen a slight decline in her favorability ratings among Granite State residents. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 47% of New Hampshire adults view her favorably, 37% view her unfavorably, and 16% are neutral or don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is at +10%, down from +24% in February, but slightly better than it was in September 2008.

Shaheen is viewed very favorably by Democrats (net +74%), slightly favorably by Independents (+8%), but very unfavorably by Republicans (net -41%).

#### Favorability Ratings – Jeanne Shaheen



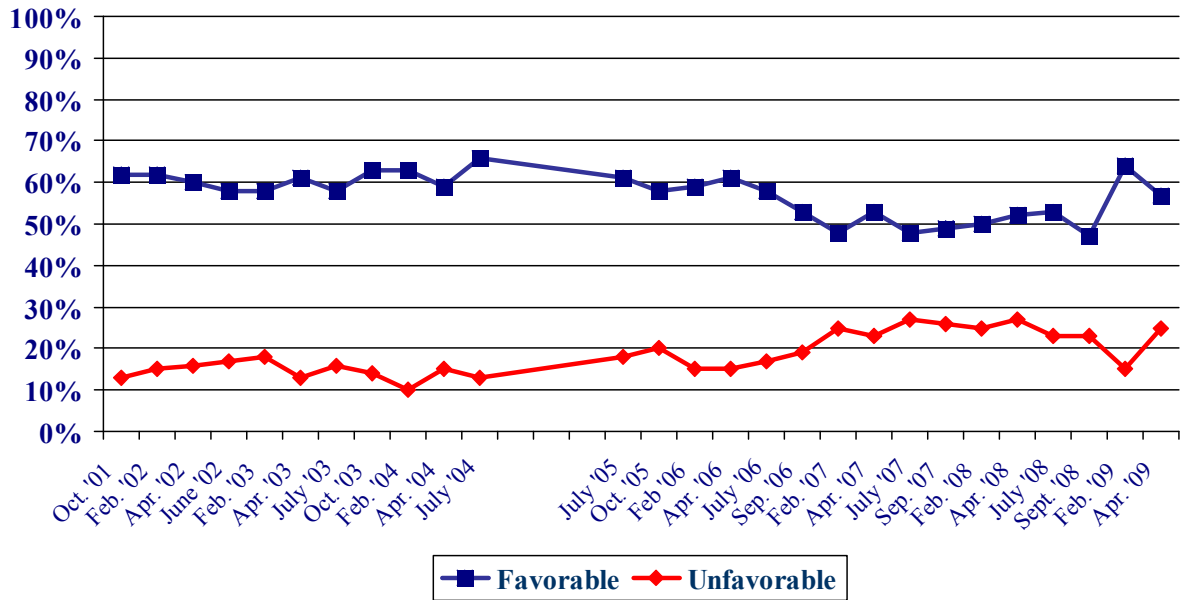

### Favorability Ratings – Senator Judd Gregg

Republican Senator Judd Gregg has seen his favorability ratings improve since last fall and he is currently the most popular member of New Hampshire’s congressional delegation. Currently, 57% of New Hampshire residents have a favorable opinion of Gregg, 25% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 19% are neutral or don’t know enough to say. Gregg’s net favorability rating is at a high +32%, but down from +49% in February.

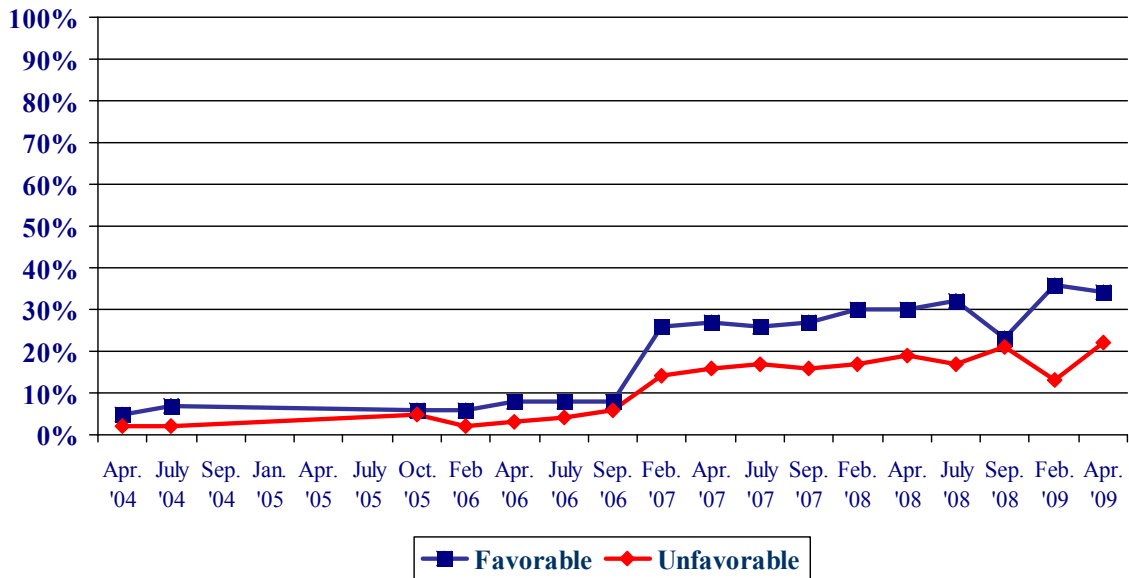
Greg is viewed very favorably by Republicans (net +76%), has strong favorability among Independents (net +39%), but is viewed unfavorably by Democrats (net -21%).

### Favorability Ratings – Senator Judd Gregg



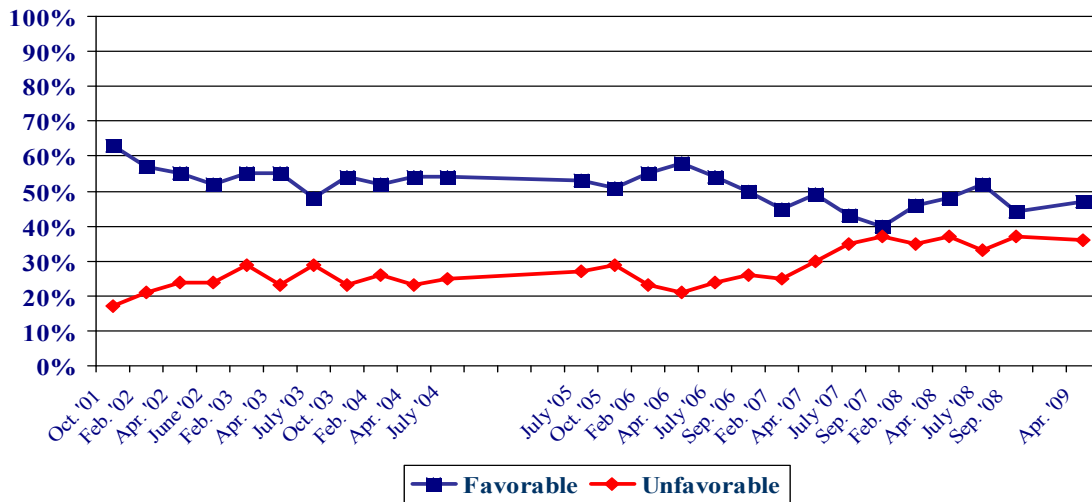
Gregg has publically said that he is not going to run for reelection to the Senate when his term ends in 2010 and Republicans are looking for a candidate to challenge Paul Hodes, the likely Democratic candidate. Hodes is a two-term Congressman from New Hampshire’s 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District, but he is still largely unknown across the state. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 34% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 22% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral and 35% don’t know enough about him to say. Hodes net favorability rating statewide is +12%.

If Gregg does not choose to run in 2010, a likely Republican candidate is former Senator John Sununu, who lost his reelection battle to Shaheen in 2008. Sununu is well known, but his popularity is still suffering from the bruising 2008 election campaign. Currently, 47% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 36% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5% are neutral, and 12% don't know enough about him to say. Sununu's net favorability rating is +11%.

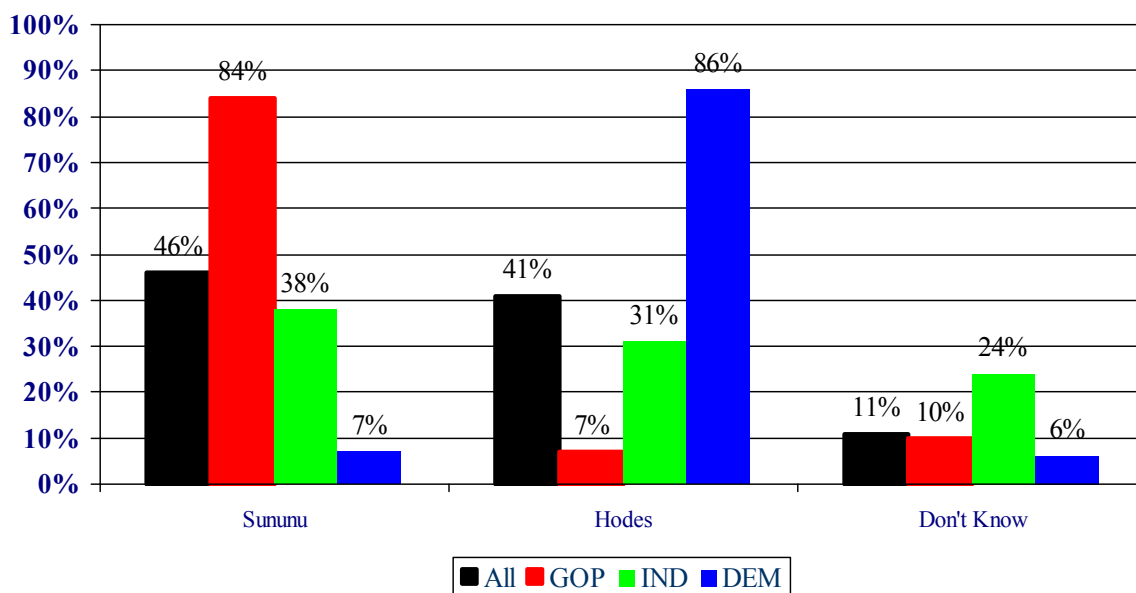
**Favorability Ratings – Former Senator John Sununu**



**2010 U.S. Senate Race**

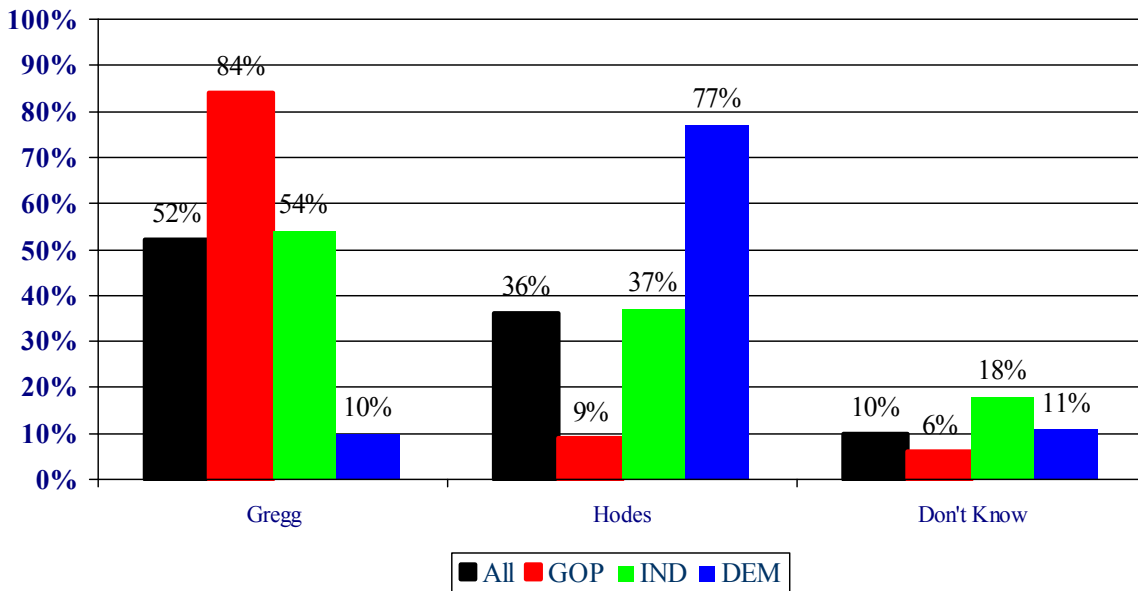
Although Sununu has not indicated that he plans to run in 2010, a hypothetical matchup for Senate between Hodes and Sununu is likely to be a close match. If the election were held today, 46% of New Hampshire likely voters say they would vote for Sununu, 41% for Hodes, 2% for some other candidate, and 11% are not sure. Both candidates have the full support of their partisans, and Sununu holds a narrow 38% to 31% lead among Independents.

Gregg has said that he will not seek reelection in 2010, but many national Republicans are pushing Gregg to run in order to keep the seat in Republican hands. Gregg is currently in good shape to keep his seat in 2010 if he decides to run for reelection against Hodes. Currently, 52% of New Hampshire likely voters said that if the 2010 election were held today, they would vote for Gregg, 36% said they would vote for Hodes, 2% would vote for some other candidate, and 10% are not sure. Gregg has a solid lead among Independents by 54% to 37%.

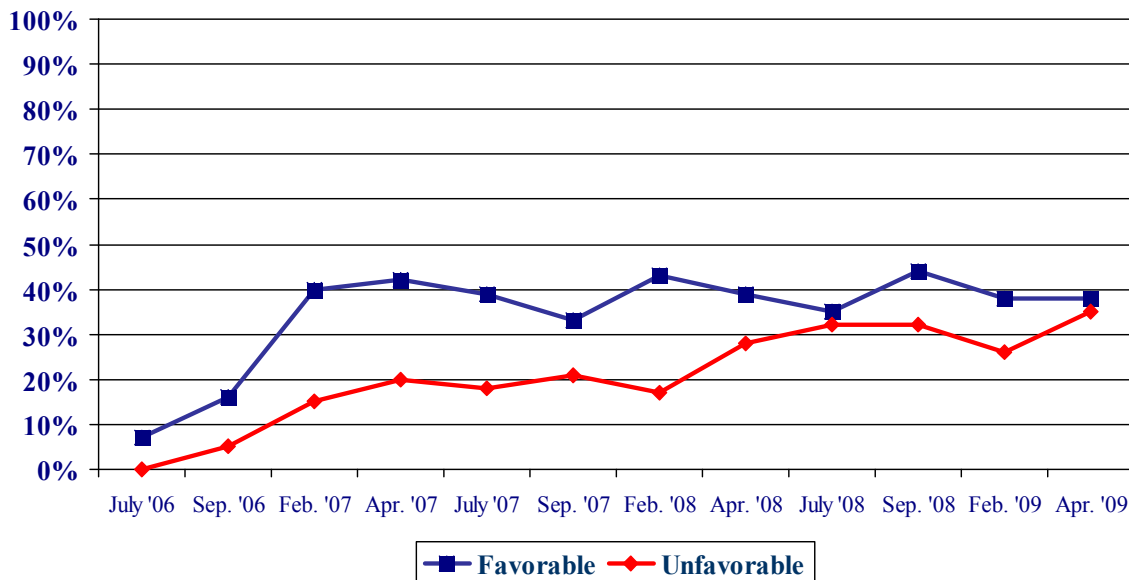
### US Senate – Gregg vs. Hodes



### Congressional Favorability Ratings –NH 1<sup>st</sup> District

First District Congressperson Carol Shea-Porter’s favorability ratings have remained stable over the past year but her unfavorable ratings have trended upwards over the past year. Currently, 38% of adults in the NH First Congressional District have a favorable opinion of her, 37% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 27% are neutral or don’t know enough to form an opinion of her. Shea-Porter’s net favorability rating stands at +1%, the lowest it has been since summer of 2008.

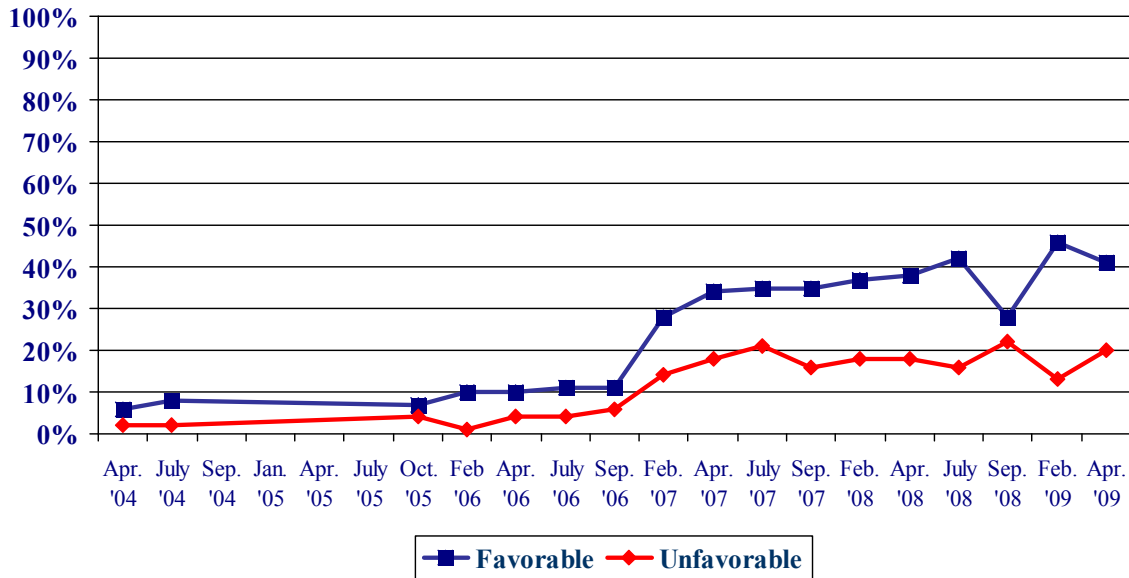
### Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1<sup>st</sup> District



### Congressional Favorability Ratings –NH 2<sup>nd</sup> District

Second District Congressman Paul Hodes' favorability ratings in his district have fallen since February. In the latest Granite State Poll, 41% of adults in the NH Second Congressional District view him favorably, 20% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 39% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Hodes' net favorability stands at +21%, down from +33% in February.

Favorability Ratings – Paul Hodes NH 2<sup>nd</sup> District

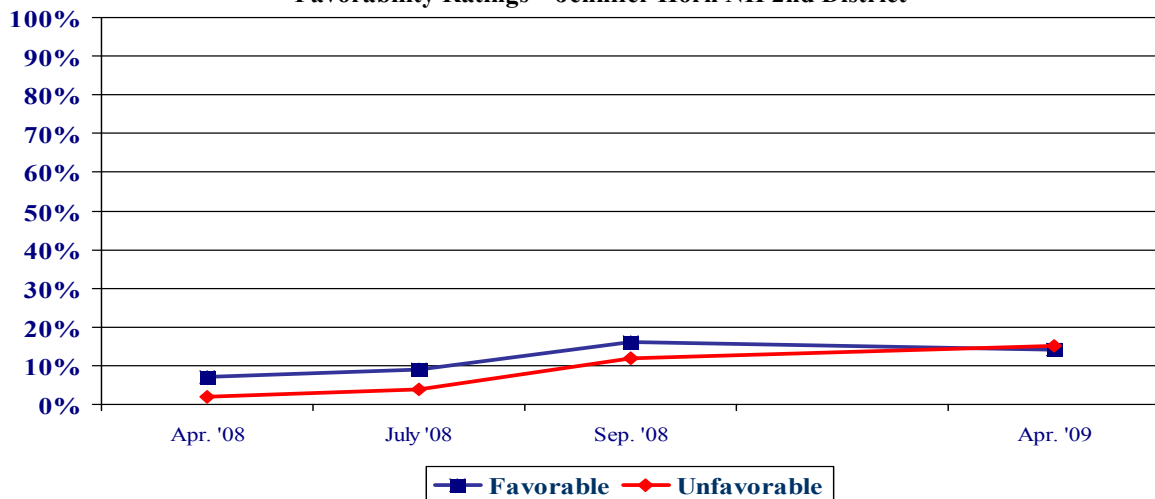


### Favorability Ratings of Potential 2010 Candidates

New Hampshire residents were asked their opinions about several potential candidates for who have either indicated they are running, or who been mentioned as candidates for 2010 midterm congressional elections.

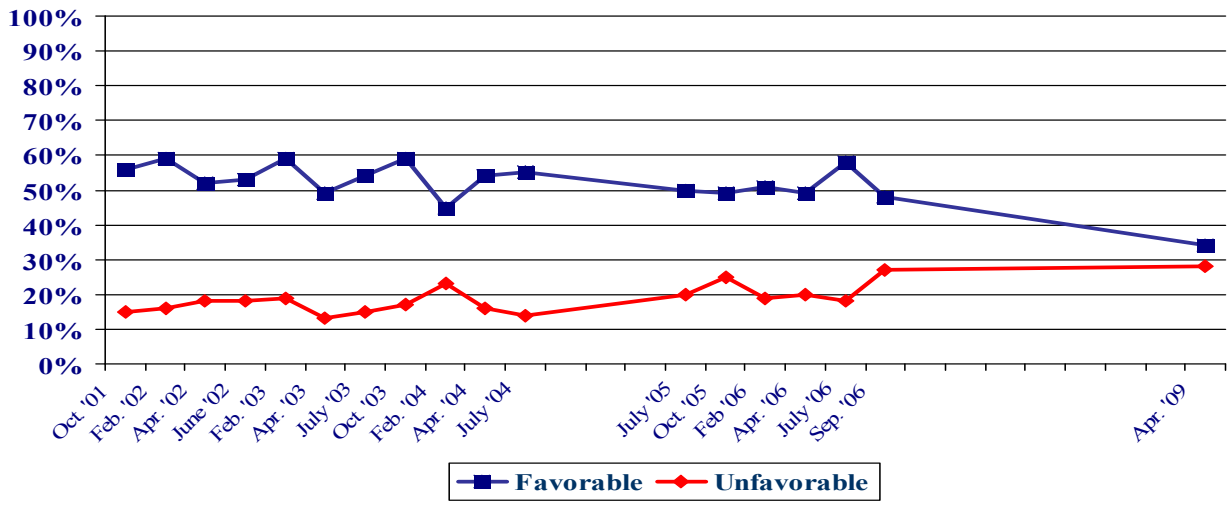
Journalist Jennifer Horn, who lost to Hodes in 2008, is said to be considering running again for the open 2nd District seat in 2010. Although she ran better than expected in 2008, Horn remains an unknown figure in among adults in the Second Congressional district. Currently, 14% of residents of the Second Congressional District have a favorable opinion of her, 15% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 61% don't know enough to say. Horn's net favorability is at -1%.

Another potential candidate in the 2nd District is former Congressman Charlie Bass, who lost to Paul Hodes in 2006. In the Second Congressional District, 34% of residents have a favorable opinion of Bass, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 9% are neutral, and 29% don't know enough to say. Bass's net favorability in the Second Congressional district also stands at +6%.

Manchester Mayor Frank Guinta is said to be considering a run for either the US Senate seat against Hodes or for the 1<sup>st</sup> District Congressional seat, but he is largely unknown outside of greater Manchester. Currently, 23% of all NH adults view him favorably, 8% view him unfavorably, 10% are neutral, and 59% don't know enough to say. In the 1<sup>st</sup> District, Guinta is somewhat better known, 30% have a favorable opinion of him, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, and 63% are neutral or don't know enough about him to say.

Portsmouth Businessman Sean Mahoney is also rumored to be considering a run for the 1st Congressional seat in 2010. Mahoney is presently an unknown figure amongst most adults in the First Congressional. Currently, only 6% of residents in the First Congressional District have a favorable opinion of him, 5% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral, and 80% don't know enough to say.
