NEW HAMPSHIRE PESSIMISTIC ABOUT AFGHANISTAN

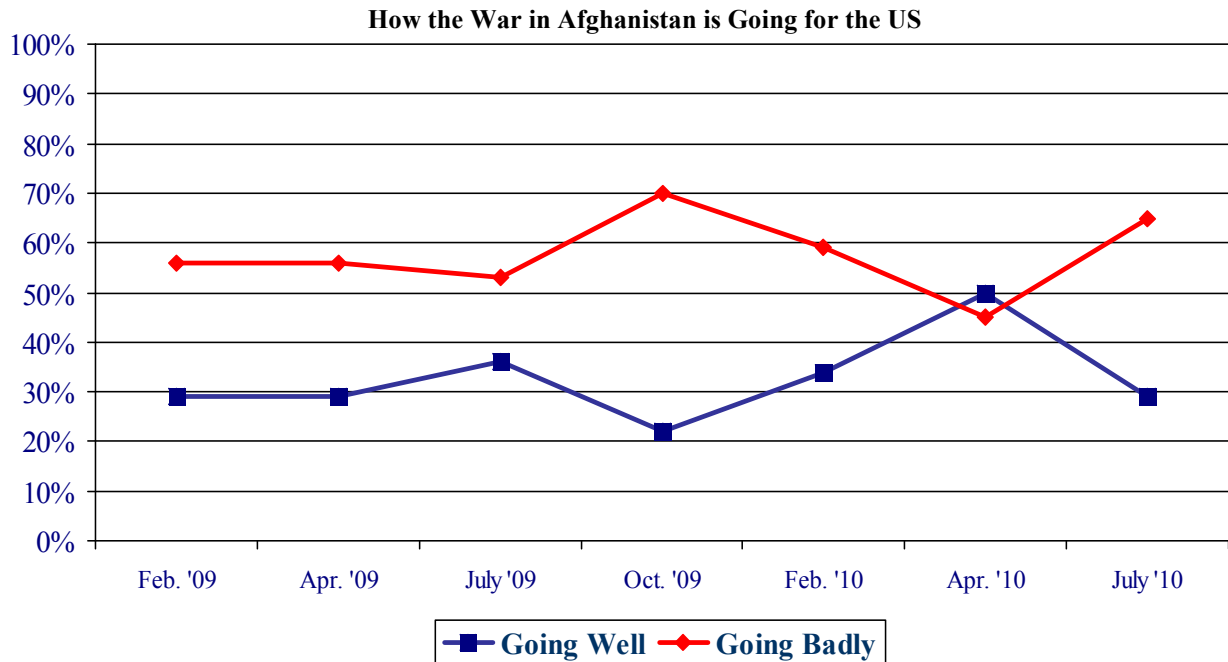

DURHAM, NH – New Hampshire residents are pessimistic about the progress of the war in Afghanistan. Approval of the Obama administration’s handling of the war in Iraq continues to decline.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred four (504) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between July 19 and July 27, 2010. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

The War in Afghanistan

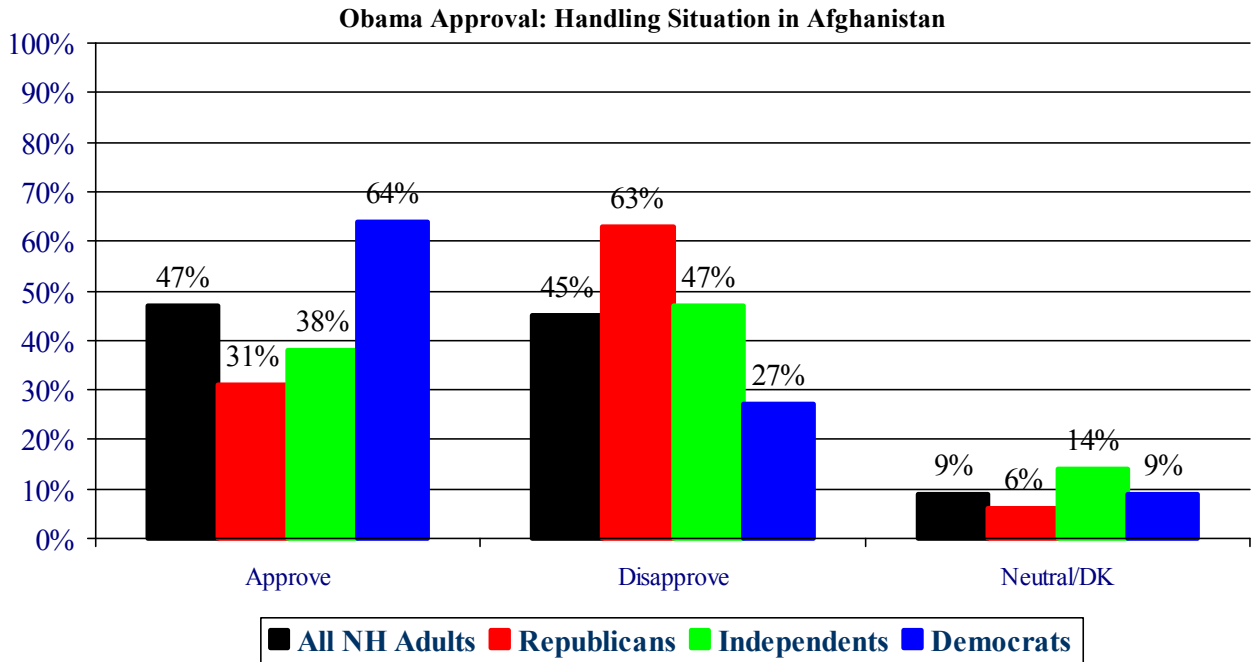
July marked the deadliest month for U.S. forces in the nine year old conflict in Afghanistan and Granite Staters’ perceptions of the progress of the war among have dropped significantly. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 65% of New Hampshire adults think the war in Afghanistan is going badly, 29% think it is going well, and 6% don’t know. The percentage of those who believe the war is going badly has risen by 20 percentage points. When last asked in April, 50% of Granite Staters thought the war was going well, and 45% believed it was going badly.

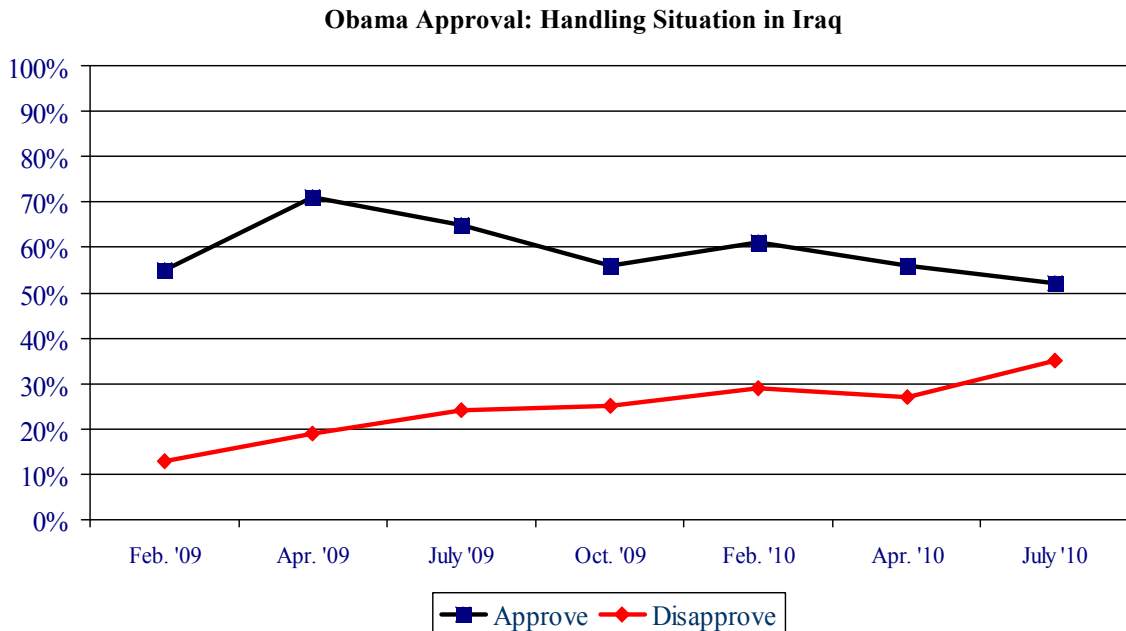
Presidential Approval on Afghanistan

While most think the war in Afghanistan is going badly for the United States, New Hampshire adults are split in their opinions of how well President Obama is handling the situation. Currently, 47% of New Hampshire adults approve of his handling of Afghanistan, 45% disapprove, and 9% are neutral or don't know. Obama receives support from a majority of Democrats (64% approve), while most Republicans and a plurality of political independents – 63% and 47%, respectively – disapprove of his handling of the conflict.

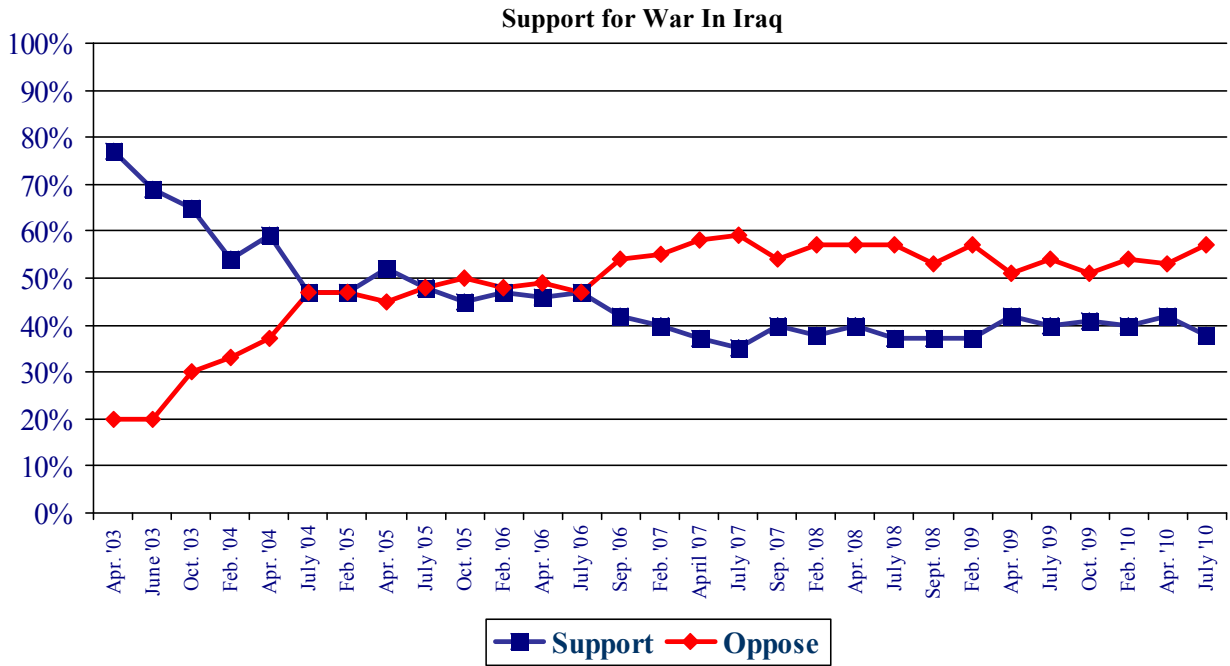


Presidential Approval on Iraq

Approval of President Obama's handling of the situation in Iraq has been declining throughout 2010, although a majority still approve of his actions. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 52% of New Hampshire adults approve of his handling of Iraq, 35% disapprove, and 12% are neutral. Obama continues hold majority support from Democrats and a plurality of political independents – 73% and 49%, respectively – but most Republicans (52%) now disapprove of the administration's actions in Iraq, up from 36% disapproval in April.

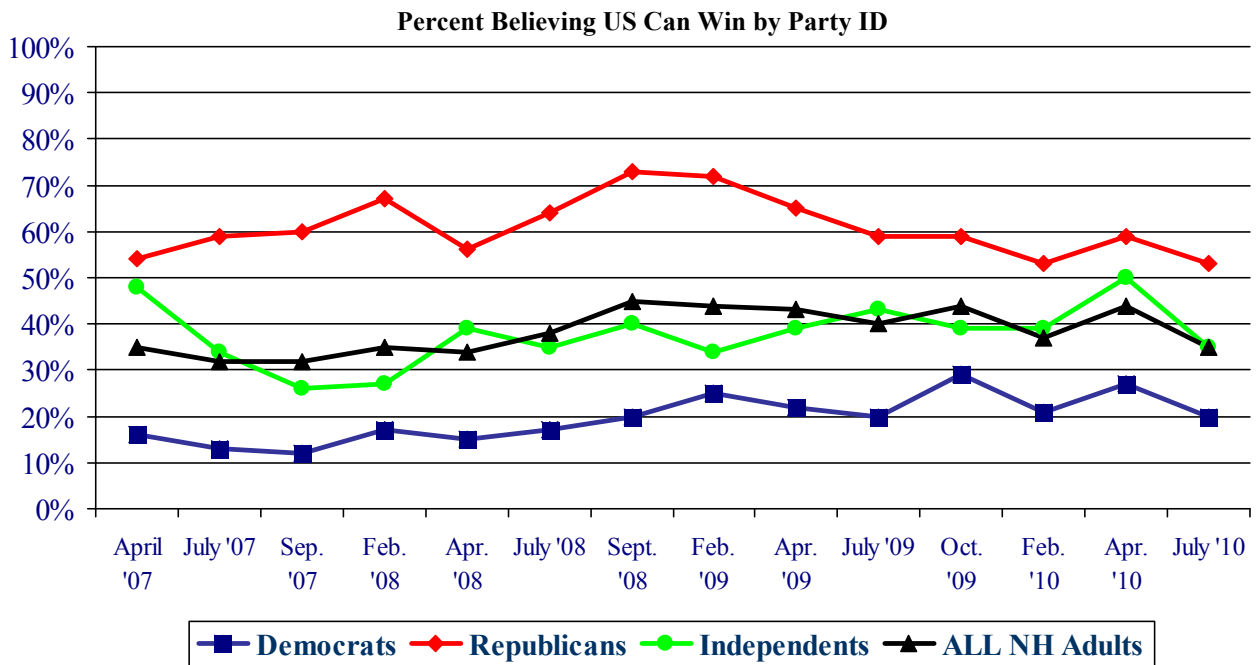


Most New Hampshire residents continue to believe that going to war in Iraq was a bad idea. Currently, 38% of Granite Staters support the US having gone to war with Iraq, 57% oppose it, and 6% are neutral. The percentage of New Hampshire adults who support or oppose the US having gone to war in Iraq has remained relatively stable for the past 3 years.



Can the US Win?

Similar to their feelings about Afghanistan, Granite Staters are pessimistic about the US winning the war in Iraq. Currently, only 35% of New Hampshire adults think the US can win the Iraq War, 48% think we cannot win, and 17% don't know. Republicans continue to be the most optimistic about the US prospects of victory in Iraq, with 53% believing the US can win. Democrats continue to be the least optimistic with only 20% thinking winning the Iraq war is possible.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred (512) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between April 18 and April 28, 2010. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
