OBAMA APPROVAL RATING REBOUNDS IN NH HEADING INTO ELECTION YEAR

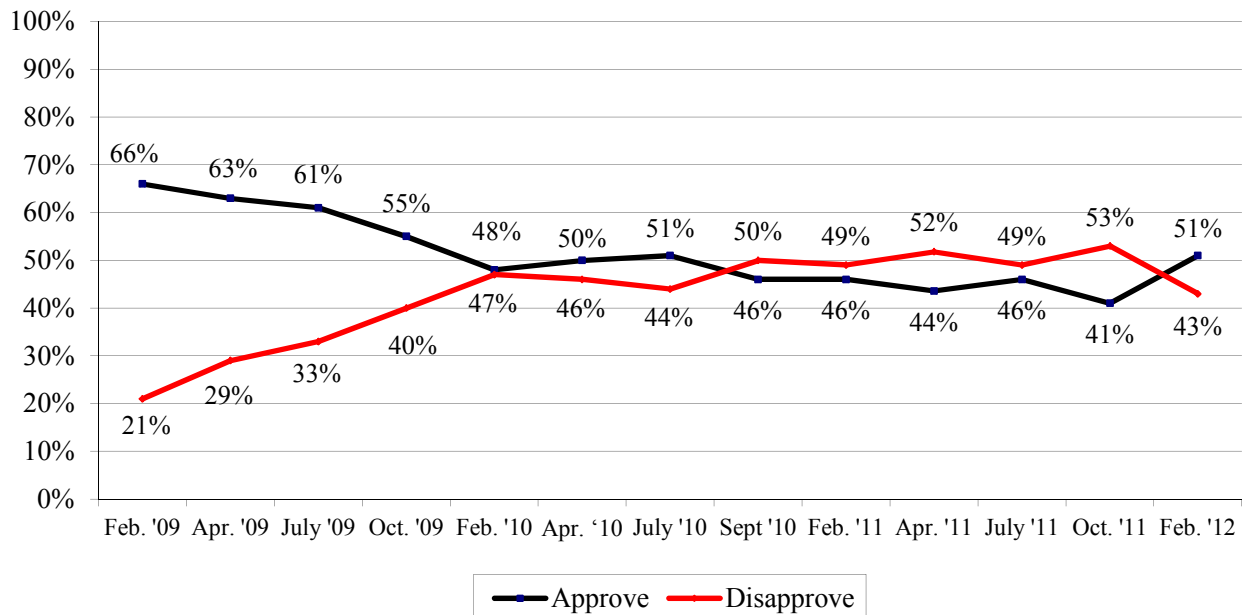
DURHAM, NH –President Barack Obama’s job approval ratings have climbed to their highest levels since July of 2010. Looking ahead to the November election, Obama now leads all four Republican candidates among likely New Hampshire voters.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred twenty-seven (527) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 25 and February 2, 2012. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. Included is a subsample of 495 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 4.4%).

Presidential Approval

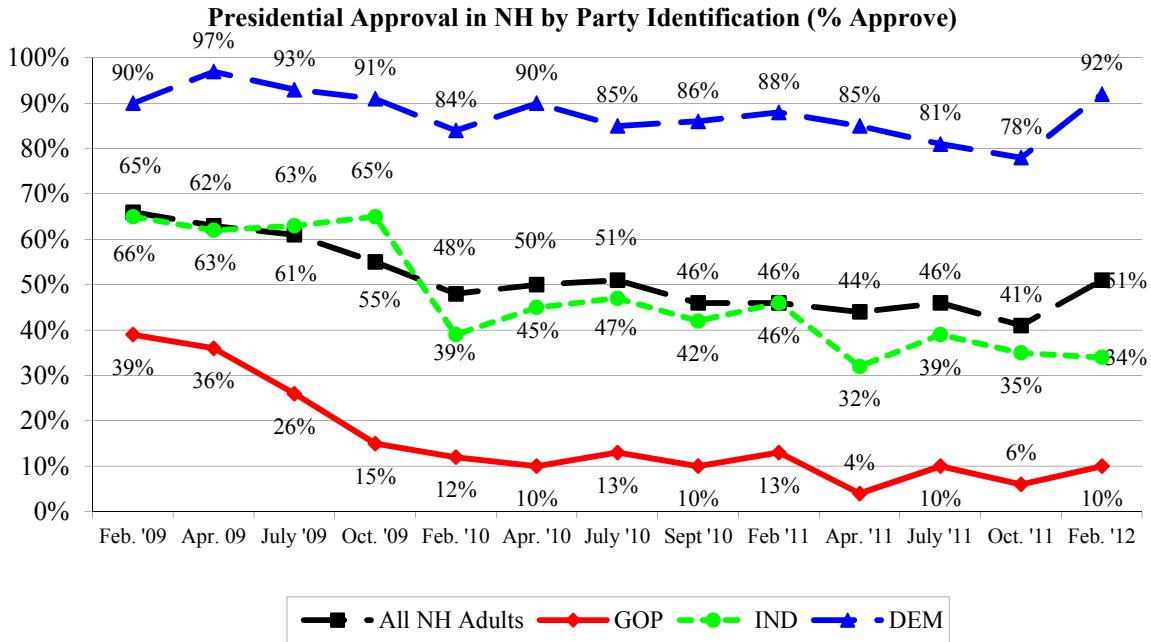
After hitting a low point in October, President Obama’s job approval ratings have rebounded in New Hampshire, climbing to their highest levels since July, 2010. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 51% of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Obama is doing as president, 43% disapprove, and 6% are neutral. These figures are higher than his national ratings, a recent Gallup poll (January 23-29) showed 45% of U.S. residents approved of the job Obama is doing as President and 48% disapproved. By comparison, George W. Bush’s New Hampshire approval rating in February 2004 stood at 47%.

Presidential Approval in NH – Barack Obama



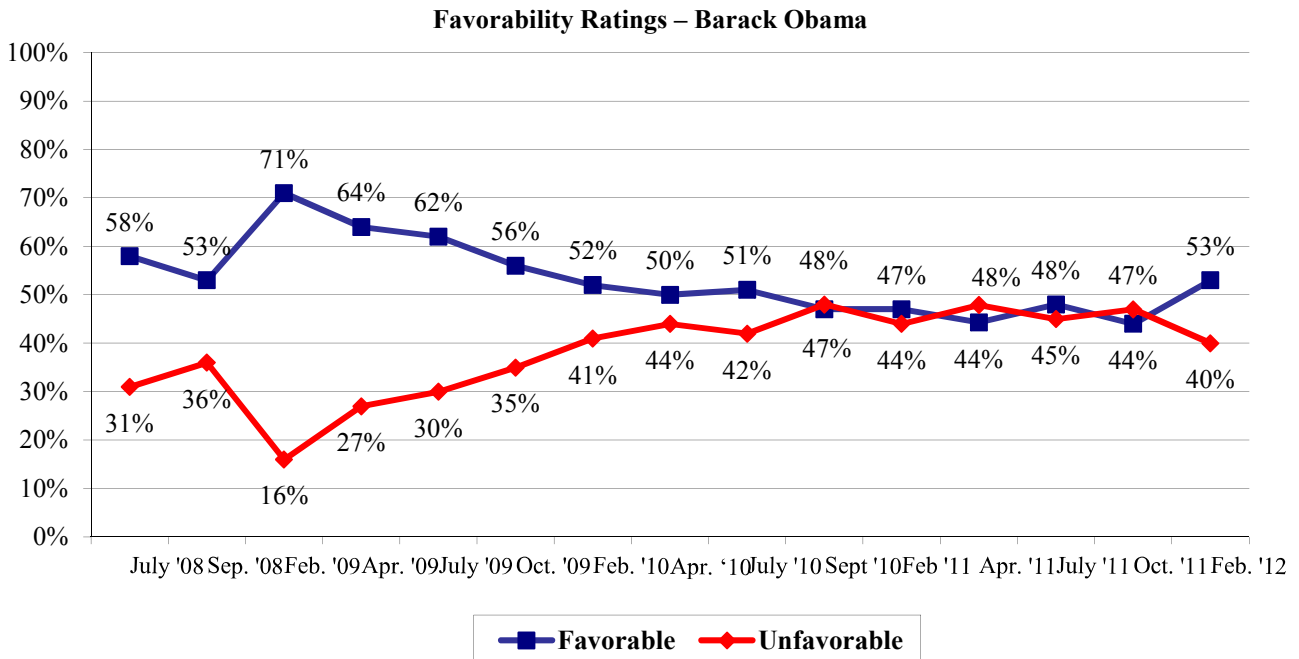

President Obama’s job approval ratings have climbed sharply among Democrats and held steady among political independents and Republicans. Nearly all Democrats (92%) approve of President Obama job performance, while just over one-third (34%) of Independents continue to say they approve and only 10% of Republicans approve. “The Republican Primary campaign seems to have revived Democratic support for President Obama,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.



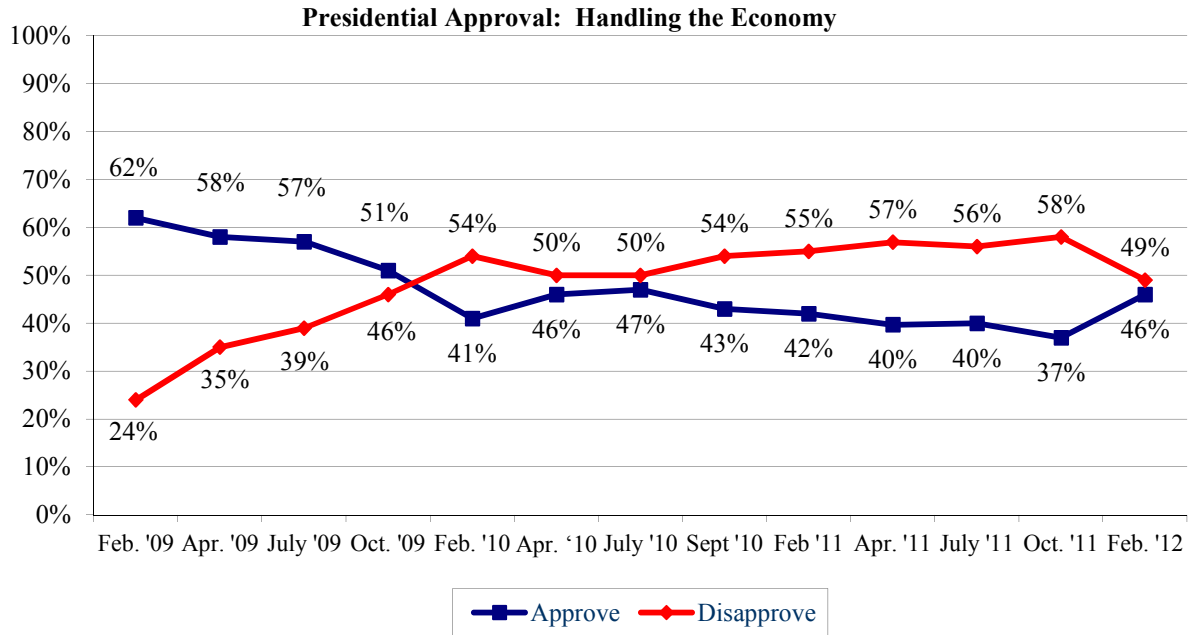
Obama’s personal favorability ratings have also rebounded. Obama is currently viewed favorably by 53% of New Hampshire adults, 40% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 7% are neutral or don’t know enough about him to say. These are his highest favorability ratings since October 2009. Obama’s net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is at +13%, up from -3% in October.

New Hampshire Democrats continue to like Obama with 93% having a favorable opinion of him, while 41% of political independents and only 11% of Republicans have a favorable opinion of the President.

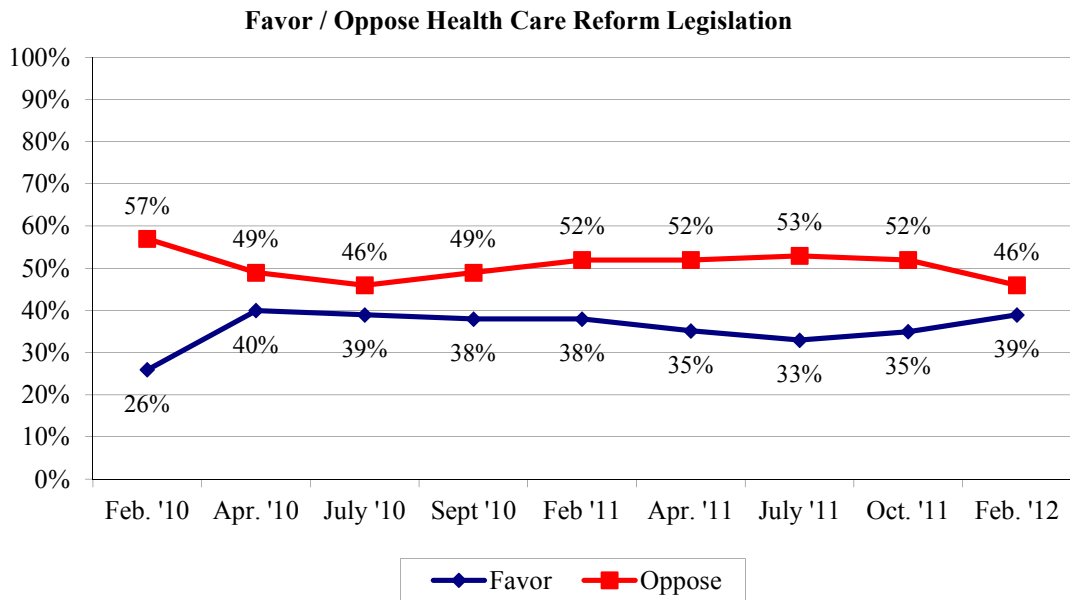


Economic Approval Rating

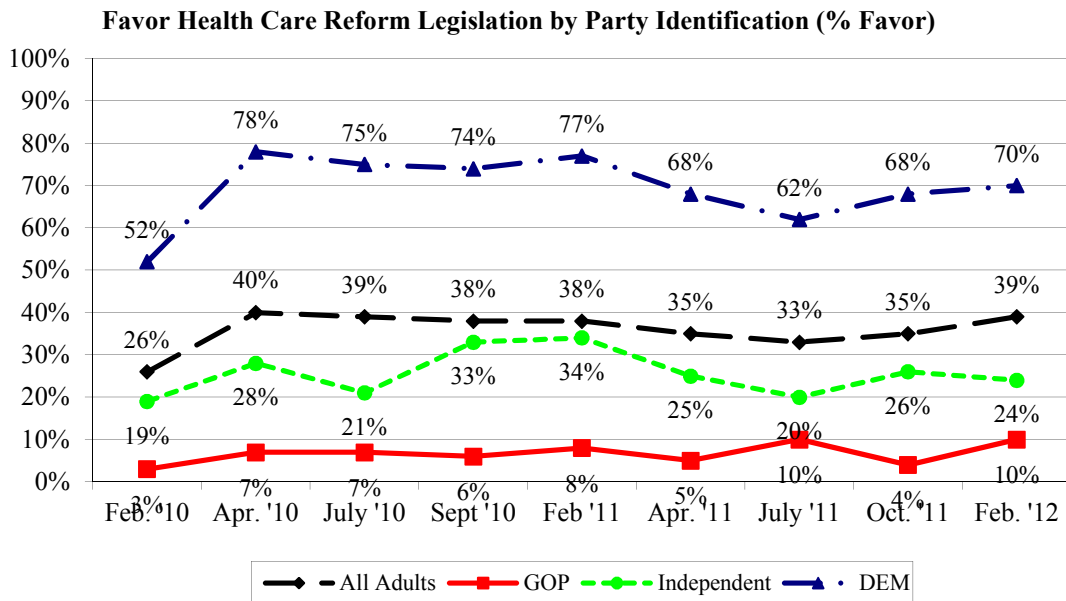
Granite Staters are divided on their opinion of President Obama's handling of the economy. Currently, 46% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Obama is handling the economy, 49% disapprove, and 5% are neutral. As with other approval measures, there is a considerable partisan gap -- most Democrats (83%) approve of Obama's handling of the economy, but only 28% of independents and 11% of Republicans approve.



Debate of Obama's health care reform legislation has continued among candidates for the Republican nomination and the Supreme Court will rule on its constitutionality later this year. More New Hampshire adults continue oppose the health care legislation passed in early 2010 than favor it. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 39% of New Hampshire adults favor the legislation, 46% oppose it, and 15% are neutral or don't know enough about it to say.



Support for the health care reform law is very weak among independents and Republicans. More than two-thirds of Democrats (70%) favor the health care reform law, while only 24% of Independents and 10% of Republicans favor the legislation.

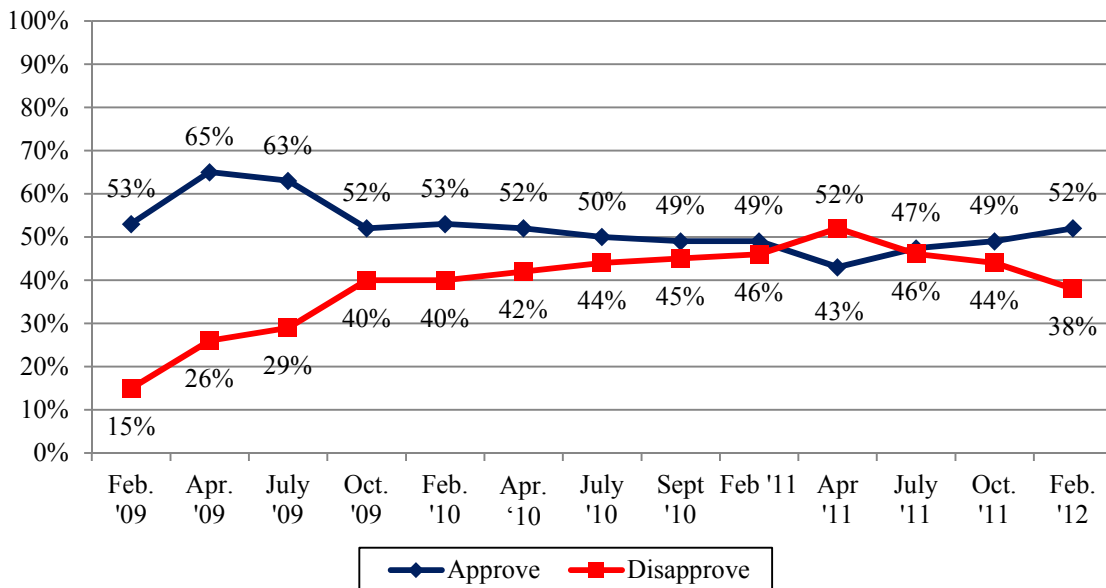


Foreign Affairs

New Hampshire residents views about the Obama Administration’s handling of foreign policy continue to improve as U.S. troops pull out of the Iraq War and with an accelerated timetable for withdrawal from Afghanistan. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 52% approve of how President Obama is handling foreign affairs, 38% disapprove, and 9% are neutral.

There is a distinct partisan divide, with 84% of Democrats, but only 19% of Republicans approving of Obama’s handling of foreign affairs. Independents are evenly divided, with 43% of Independents approving and 43% disapproving.

Presidential Approval: Foreign Affairs

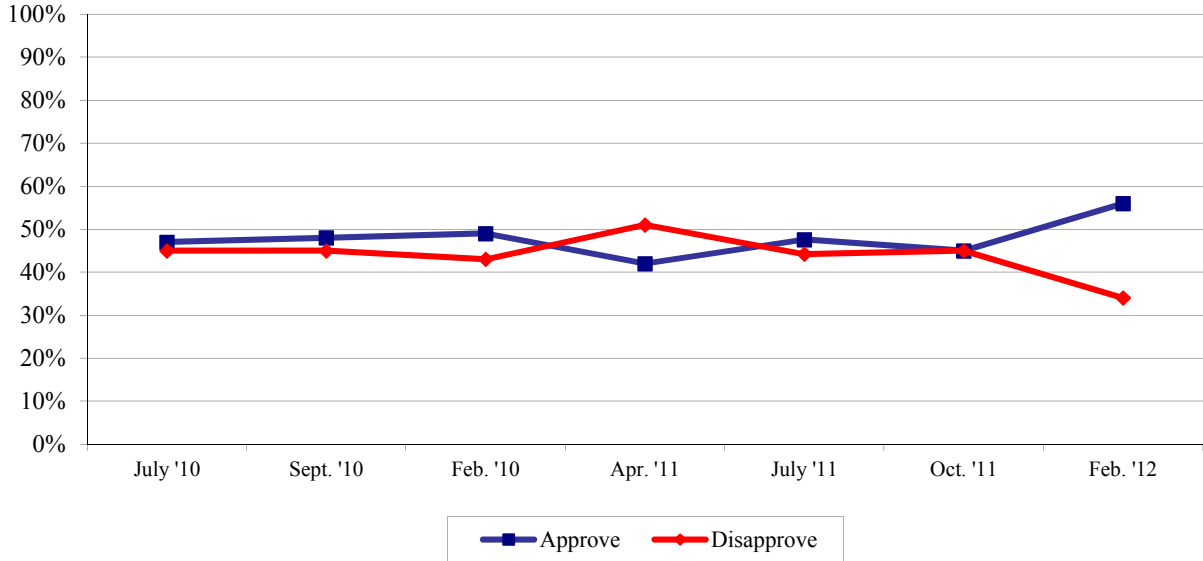


Afghanistan

New Hampshire residents' approval President Obama's handling of the war in Afghanistan are at their highest levels since he took office. Currently, 56% of New Hampshire adults approve of his handling of Afghanistan, 34% disapprove, and 10% are neutral or don't know.

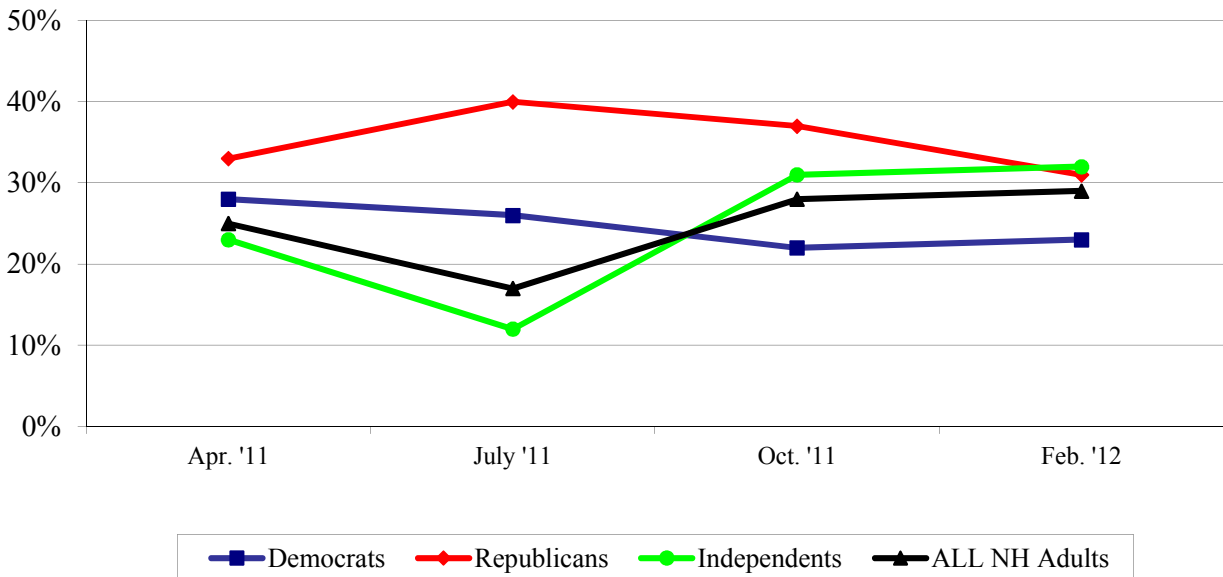
Democrats (76%) are most likely to approve of his handling of the situation in Afghanistan, and a plurality of Independents (49%) approve. Republicans continue to disapprove, with 37% approving and 49% disapproving of his actions in Afghanistan.

New Hampshire adults remain very pessimistic about the chances that the United States can be successful in Afghanistan. Currently, only 29% believe the U.S can win in Afghanistan, 58% think we cannot win, and 13% are not sure.

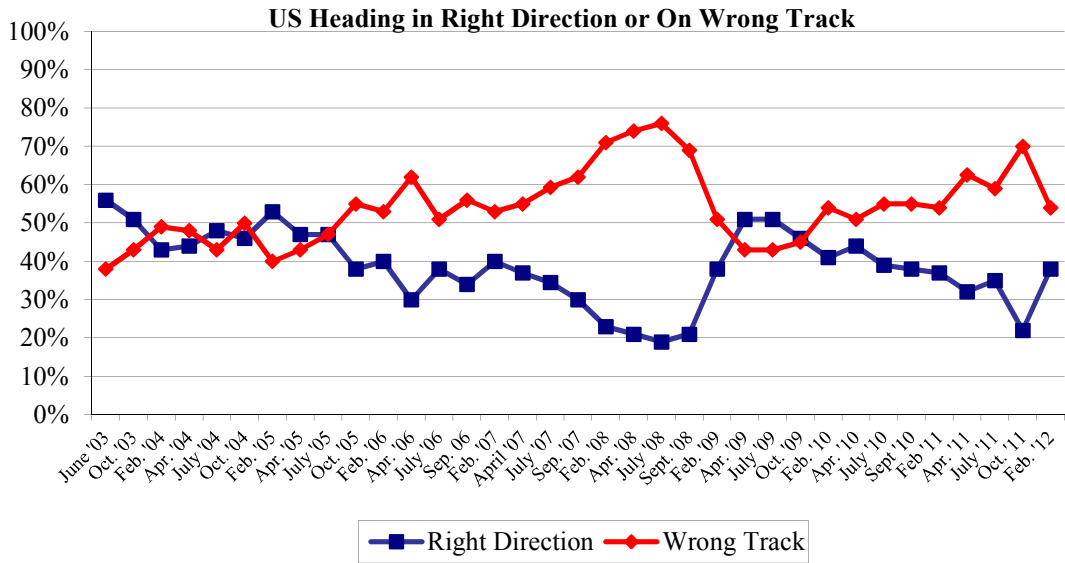
Percent Believing U.S. Can Win in Afghanistan by Party



Right Direction – Wrong Track

Overall, Granite Staters remain pessimistic about the direction the country is heading, though the optimism has increased in recent months. Currently, 38% of New Hampshire adults think things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 54% think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 8% don't know. The percentage of New Hampshire residents who think the country is headed in the wrong direction has declined 16 percentage points since October.

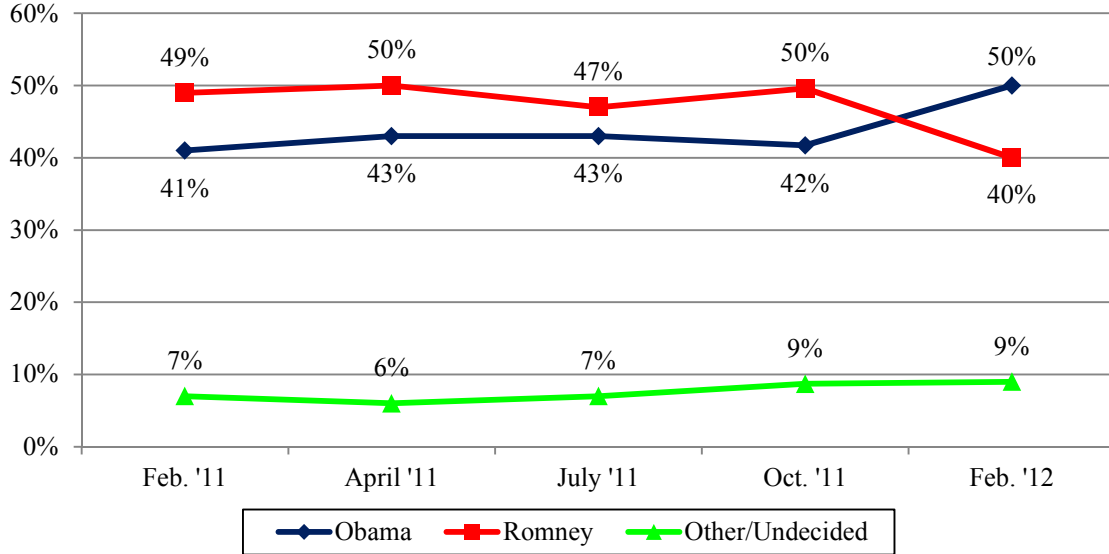
Democrats are the most optimistic about the county's direction, with 63% saying the country is going in the right direction, but only 31% of Independents and 13% of Republicans agree with this view.



2012 Presidential Election

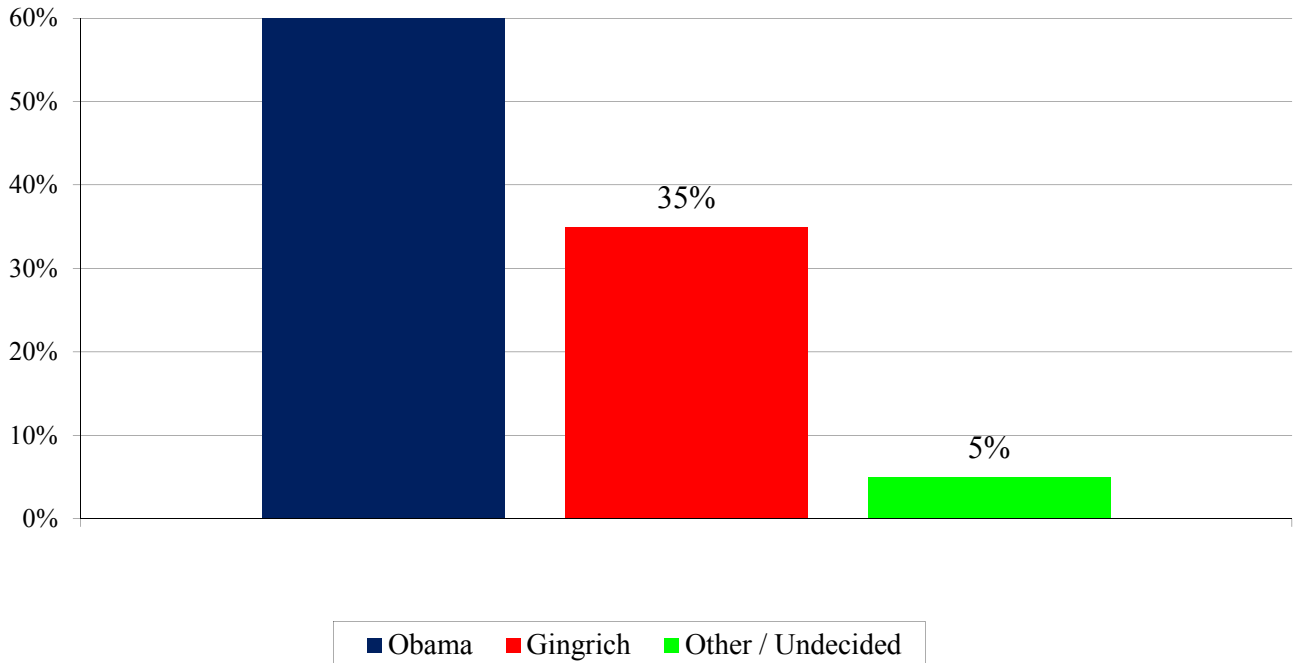
Looking ahead to the 2012 general election, President Obama is now leads all his potential GOP challengers. In a hypothetical race between Obama and Mitt Romney, the current GOP frontrunner, Obama leads with 50% to 40% for Romney, 2% for some other candidate, and 9% are undecided. Romney had led Obama for the past year.

(Likely 2012 General Election Voters)



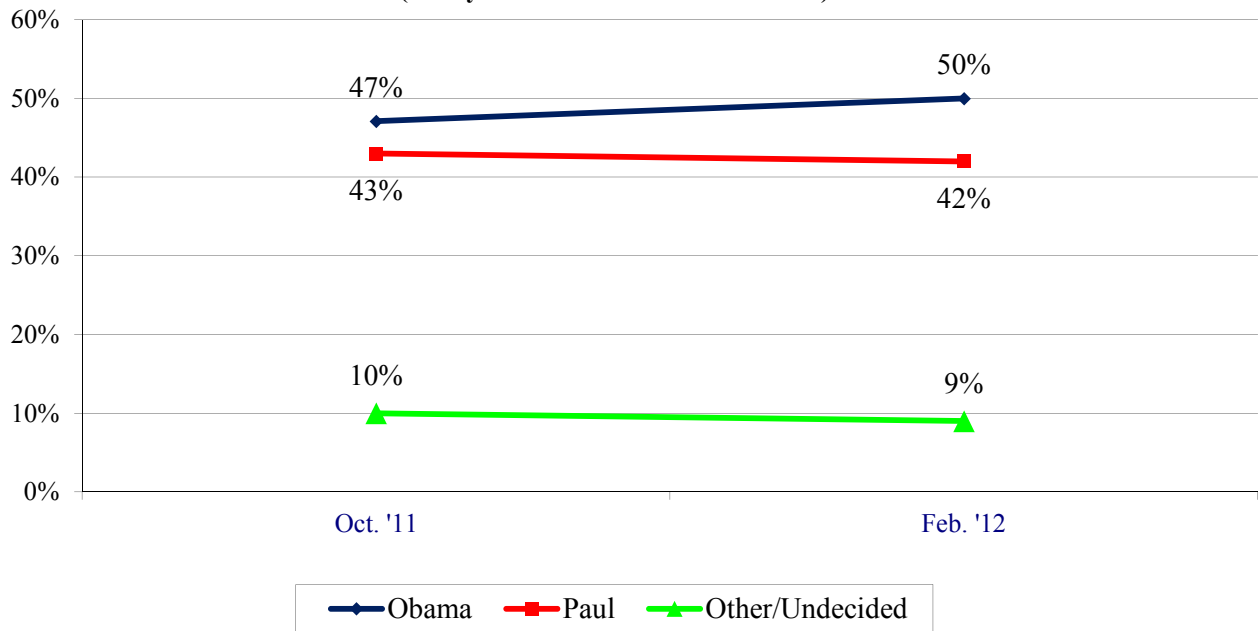
Obama's lead is more pronounced when matched against former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich, where he holds a 25 percentage point lead. Currently, 60% of likely 2012 New Hampshire voters support Obama, only 35% support Gingrich, 2% prefer some other candidate, and 3% are undecided. In this matchup, Obama gets support from 95% of Democrats and 56% of Independents, while only 77% of Republicans support Gingrich.

60% (Likely 2012 General Election Voters)



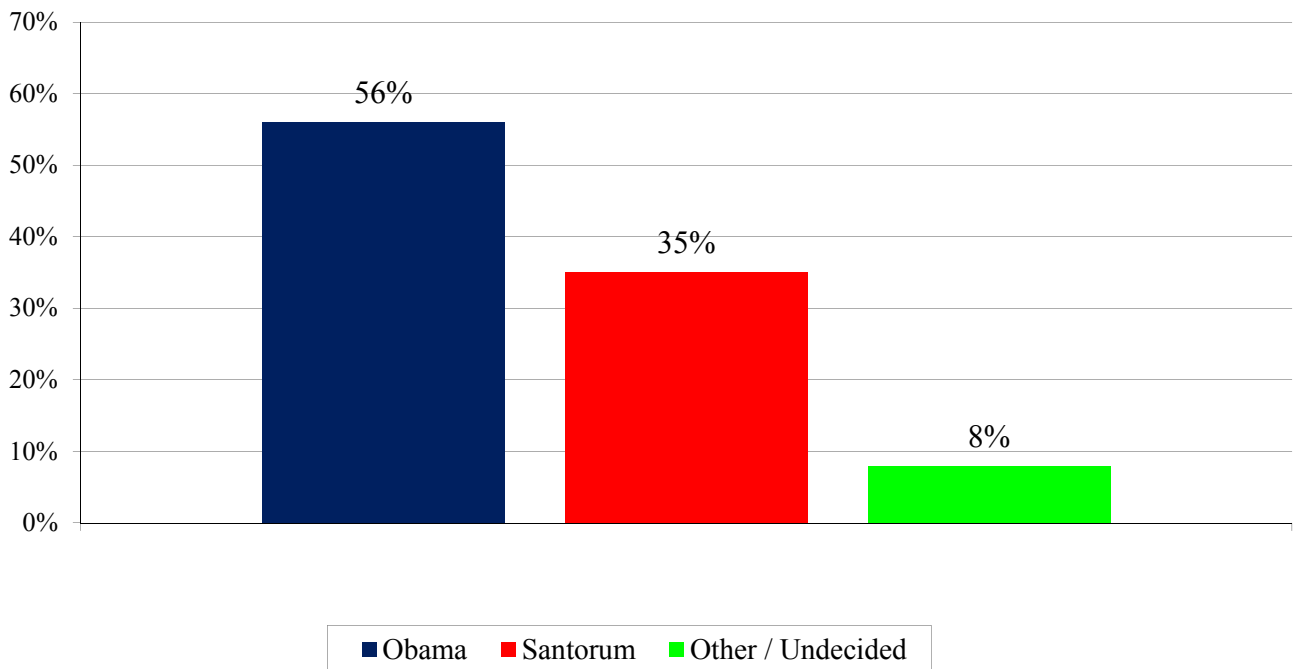
The Republican who is currently doing best against Obama is Texas Congressman Ron Paul. In this matchup, Obama holds a modest 50% to 42% lead with 2% favoring some other candidate and 7% undecided. However, political Independents favor Paul 45% to 37%.

And when Obama is matched against former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum, Obama holds a 56% to 35% lead with 2% favoring some other candidate and 6% undecided. Independents favor Obama over Santorum by 49% to 39%.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred twenty-seven (527) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 25 and February 2, 2012. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. Included is a subsample of 495 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 4.4%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
