ECONOMY, HONESTY, AND HEALTH CARE TOP VOTER CONCERNS IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – The economy, candidate honesty, and health care are the most important topics on the minds of voters in the New Hampshire Democratic Primary.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll**, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center, and sponsored by WMUR-TV, Manchester, New Hampshire.* Four hundred forty-six (446) randomly selected likely Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between November 6 and November 13, 2003. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.6 percent. (For more detailed results, visit the Survey Center web site at www.unh.edu/survey-center and click on Press Releases.)

Top Issues

Although the national economy appears to be on the road to recovery, Democratic voters in New Hampshire say that fixing the economy is the issue they think is most important in the 2004 New Hampshire Democratic primary. Among likely Democratic primary voters, 19 percent say that the economy is most important to their decision about which candidate they will vote for followed by the honesty of the candidate (13%), the cost of health care (12%), improving relations with other countries (11%), and ending the war in Iraq (10%).

There are few differences in the importance of issues between backers of the major Democratic candidates. Supporters of former Vermont Governor Howard Dean say the most important issues in their decision to support Dean are the economy (20%), honesty (14%), ending the war in Iraq (13%), the cost of health care (11%), and expanding health insurance coverage (10%). For supporters of Massachusetts Senator John Kerry, the most important issues are the economy (24%), honesty (15%), improving relations with other countries (13%), and ending the war in Iraq (12%).

Candidate Issues and Characteristics

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked to name the candidate they most closely associate with several issues and candidate characteristics. Since Dean leads the field by a wide margin as measured in the WMUR NH Primary Poll, it is not surprising that he is cited most often. (As reported on November 14, Dean leads the field with 38% to 16% for Kerry. None of the other candidates exceeded 5%.)

Dean is cited most frequently as the candidate with the best plan to reduce the cost of health care and to increase health insurance coverage. Dean is also cited as the candidate who most effectively criticizes President George w. Bush, the most honest candidate, with the best plan to improve the economy, and with the best plan to create more jobs.

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Kerry is cited most frequently as the most loyal Democrat and the candidate best able to improve relations with other countries. However, he is also most frequently named as the candidate who has changed his/her position on the issues most.

Retired General Wesley Clark is cited most often as the candidate best able to deal with terrorism both inside and outside the United States.

And while it is cited as one of the most important issues to Democratic voters, no candidate is recognized by a large percentage of voters as having the best plan to end the war in Iraq.

Reason for Favoring Chosen Candidate

In a further attempt to figure out why they are voting for the candidate they support, likely democratic primary voters were asked the main reason they planned to vote for the chosen candidate. Overall, 18 percent cite the candidate's position on the issues, 15 percent say they just know him or her better than the other candidates, 10 percent cite the candidate's background and experience, 9 percent cite their honesty and candor, 7 percent say they have the best chance to beat Bush, and 7 percent cite the candidates health care plan.

Dean backers cite his positions on the issues (17%), that they are more familiar with him (14%), his honesty (13%), and his health care plan (9%) as the main reasons they plan to vote for him. Kerry supporters say they are more familiar with him (23%), cite his experience (22%), his positions on the issues (19%), and that he has the best chance to beat Bush (11%) as the main reasons they are supporting him. Clark voters cite his military background (32%), his foreign policy experience (13%), that they are more familiar with him (11%), and that he has the best chance to beat Bush (11%) as reasons for supporting him.

Who Can Beat Bush?

The eventual Democratic nominee will face Bush in the November 2004 election, but likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters are divided over which candidate can beat Bush – 37 percent say that Dean has the best chance of defeating Bush, 21 percent name Kerry, 8 percent name Clark, 6 percent name Missouri Congressman Dick Gephardt, 3 percent name North Carolina Senator John Edwards, 2 percent name Connecticut Senator Joe Lieberman, 3 percent name some other candidate, and 20 percent don't know.

WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent WMUR NH Primary Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from November 6 to November 13, 2003. A random sample of 446 likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.6 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
