ONE WEEK TO GO - CLINTON HOLDS SLIM LEAD OVER OBAMA IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – With less than one week to go before the primary, Clinton holds a narrow lead over Obama among New Hampshire Democrats. However, more than half say they have not yet decided who they will finally vote for.

These findings are based on the latest CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred twenty-one (521) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 27 and December 30, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.3%.

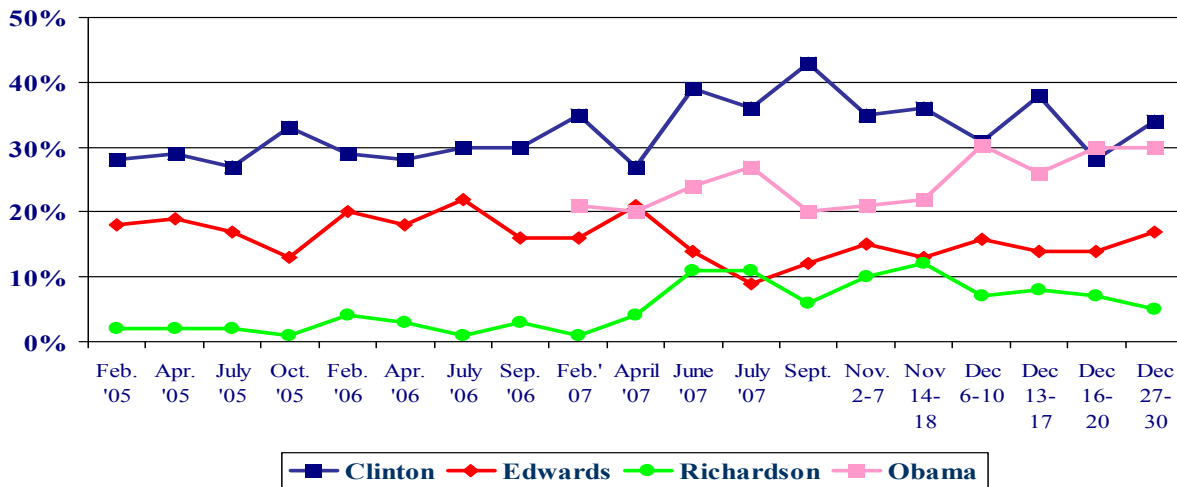
Democratic Primary

After campaigning for more than a year, and with only one week to go, New York Senator Hillary Clinton holds a narrow lead over Illinois Senator Barack Obama in the New Hampshire Democratic primary. Currently, 34% say they support Clinton, 30% support Obama, 17% favor former North Carolina Senator John Edwards, followed by New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson (5%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (3%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (2%), some other candidate (1%), and 8% say they are still undecided.

Clinton gets her strongest support from voters with lower levels of income and lower levels of education and residents of greater Manchester. Obama's support is fairly evenly balanced across demographic groups.

However, only 42% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 27% say they are leaning toward a candidate and 32% said they are still trying to decide. Among voters who say they have definitely decided who they will vote for 46% name Clinton, 28% name Obama and 18% name Edwards.

NH Democratic Presidential Primary – Likely Democratic Primary Voters

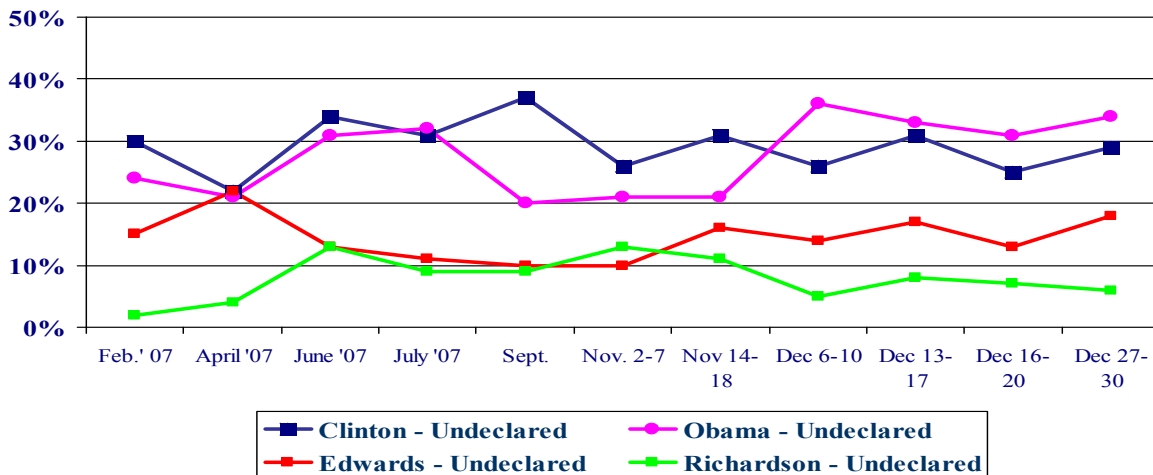

Undeclared Voters

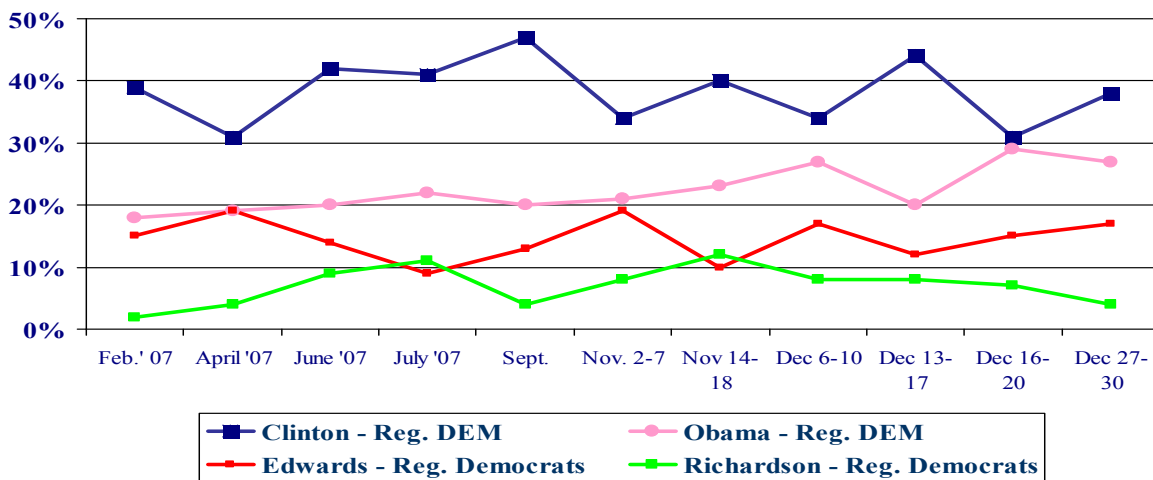
Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Currently, 63% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Democratic primary, Obama holds a narrow lead over Clinton by 34% to 29% with 18% favoring Edwards, and 6% supporting Richardson. Obama has led among undeclareds for the past month.

But registered Democrats make up 58% of likely voters and among registered Democrats, Clinton holds a 37% to 29% lead over Obama with 18% favoring Edwards and 5% preferring Richardson.

Issues

On the major issues in the Democratic nomination campaign, Clinton holds significant leads over her rivals. When asked which candidate is best able to handle the war in Iraq, 23% name Clinton, 23% name Obama, and 12% name Edwards. Similarly, 39% think Clinton is best able to handle the economy, 22% name Obama and 16% name Edwards. And on the issue of health care, 50% think Clinton is best able to handle health care, 17% name Obama and 17% name Edwards.

Candidate Qualities

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Democratic candidates. Clinton has been leading the field, in part, because she is perceived as the Democrat who has the best chance of winning in November. Forty-five percent of likely Democratic primary voters believe Clinton has the best chance of defeating the GOP candidate in November, 22% think Obama has the best chance, and 16% think Edwards has the best chance.

Clinton is also seen as the candidate with the right experience to be President – 45% name Clinton, only 13% name Obama, 10% name Edwards, and 7% name Richardson.

A significant weakness for Clinton is that she is still not well liked by Democratic voters. Forty-one percent think Obama is the most likable candidate followed by Edwards (24%) and Clinton (17%). This has been one of Obama's strengths throughout the campaign.

Another strong point for Obama is that he is viewed as the most honest candidate – 29% say Obama is the most honest candidate followed by Edwards (21%) and Clinton (17%).

Obama is also seen as the candidate best able to bring needed change to the U.S. – Obama is named by 39% followed by Clinton (30%) and Edwards (15%).

Still Up In the Air

Almost half of likely Democratic primary voters (48%) say they have always supported their current candidate, 47% say they have changed their mind and 5% don't know. Clinton supporters are most likely to say they have always supported her (61%) compared with only 45% of Obama supporters who say they have always supported him. Among current Clinton supporters who have changed their minds, 35% said they used to support Obama and 23% used to support Edwards. Among Obama supporters who have changed their minds, 41% say they used to support Clinton and 23% used to support Edwards.

Most New Hampshire Democrats say they will finally decide who they will vote for between now and the primary – 24% say they will decide on election day, 14% say they will decide the final weekend, 15% will decide this week, and 45% say they have already decided who they will support. Sixty percent of Clinton supporters say they have already decided they will vote for her compared to 40% of Obama supporters and 49% of Edwards supporters.

This indecision is typical in New Hampshire. According to exit polls, in both 2000 and 2004, more than one-quarter of voters said they made up their minds who to vote for in the final weekend

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

The **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll** is conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred twenty-one (521) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 27 and December 30, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.3%. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
