McCain & Giuliani Top NH Field, Romney Gaining

DURHAM, NH – John McCain and Rudy Giuliani remain tied for the lead among New Hampshire Republicans. However, support for Mitt Romney has increased in recent months

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,² conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by CNN and WMUR-TV, Manchester. Three hundred six (306) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between March 27 and April 3, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.6%.

Republican Primary

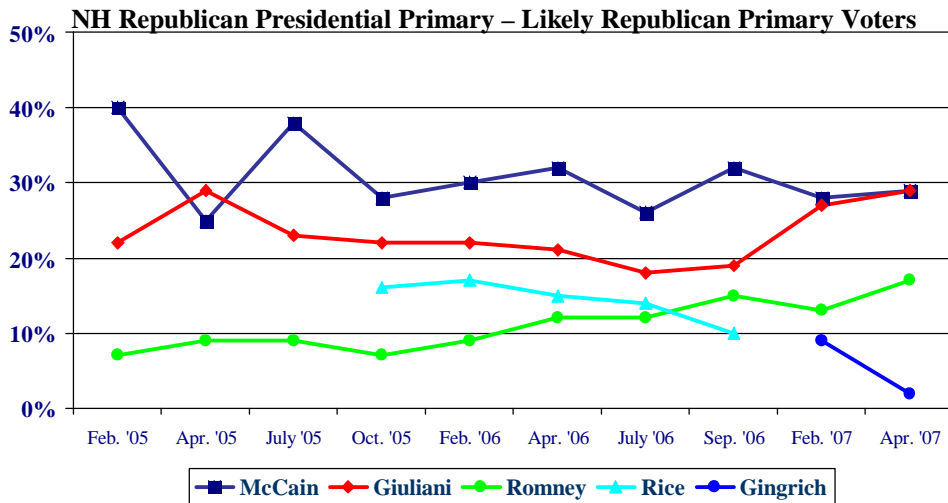
Although there are more than 10 months until the New Hampshire Primary, the race among Republicans has already heated up. In the most recent CNN / WMUR Granite State Poll, Arizona Senator John McCain and former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani are in a dead heat among likely Republican Primary voters. Currently, 29% of Republicans say they will vote for McCain, 29% will vote for Giuliani, and 17% favor Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney.

After the Big Three, former Tennessee Senator, and television star Fred Thompson is favored by 3% of likely Republican Primary voters, followed by former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich (2%), former Wisconsin Governor Tommy Thompson (2%), Colorado Congressman Tom Tancredo (1%), Kansas Senator Sam Brownback (1%), Nebraska Senator Chuck Hagel (1%), former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (1%), Texas Congressman Ron Paul (1%), while 1% favor some other candidate and 14% are undecided.

McCain and Giuliani have led the Republican field for the past two years and were essentially tied in February – McCain was at 28% and Giuliani at 27%. Support for Romney has increased somewhat from 13% to 17% in the past two months. The only significant movement is that support for Newt Gingrich has dropped from 9% in February to 2% in the most recent poll.

Undeclared voters continue to say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary, meaning the Republican primary electorate will have fewer independent voters than in 2000. Currently, undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary by a 73% to 27% margin, and increase from 68% to 32% in February.

Republican Favorability Ratings

Giuliani, McCain, and Romney are the best known and most popular candidates among Republican primary voters. Giuliani continues to be the most popular GOP candidate with 72% of likely voters saying they have a favorable opinion of him, 18% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 2% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is a very high +54%, essentially unchanged from +56% in February. Giuliani has high favorability ratings among most voters, but receives his highest ratings from voters with lower levels of income and education.

McCain is the second most favorable Republican candidate – 69% of likely Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of him, 19% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 4% don't know enough about him to say. McCain's net favorability rating is +50%, up from +32% in February. There are few differences in how different groups of Republicans voters view McCain.

Romney continues to have solid favorability ratings with 59% having a favorable opinion of him, 26% are unfavorable, 9% are neutral, and 6% don't know enough to say. Romney's net favorability rating is +33%, up from +26% in February. Romney is viewed most favorably by older voters and voters who moved to NH from the South, West and Midwest.

Gingrich is well known, but he has unfavorable ratings among Republican voters have increased in recent months. Currently, only 25% have a favorable opinion of Gingrich, 49% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 10% are neutral, and 6% don't know enough to say. His net favorability rating is a very low -14%, down from -1% in February.

Newcomer Fred Thompson is viewed favorably by 29% of Republican voters, 12% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12% are neutral, and 47% don't know enough about him to say. Thompson's net favorability rating is +17%.

None of the other Republican candidates are particularly well known or liked by Republican voters. Hagel is largely unknown and is disliked by Republican primary voters – 55% don't know anything about him and his net favorability rating is -11%, down from -9% in February. Huckabee has visited NH several times in recent months, but he is also largely unknown – 55% don't know anything about him and his net favorability rating is -1%. Tommy Thompson is still unknown with 55% of likely voters saying they don't know enough about him to have a favorable or unfavorable opinion. His net favorability rating is +1%, up from -3%.

Fifty-nine percent of likely primary voters don't know anything about Brownback – his net favorability rating is -6%, down from -2%. Tancredo is unknown to 66% of likely GOP primary voters and his net favorability rating is -3%, down from -1%. California Congressman Duncan Hunter is unknown to 70% of likely GOP primary voters and his net favorability rating is -8% from -10% in February. Sixty-eight percent of likely primary voters don't know anything about former Virginia Governor Jim Gilmore – his net favorability rating remains at -8%. Ron Paul is unknown to 67% of likely GOP primary voters – his net favorability rating is -7%, unchanged from -6% in February. Businessman John Cox is unknown to 76% of likely GOP primary voters and his net favorability rating remained at -8%.

Candidate Liabilities

There has been considerable discussion about the liabilities of the top three Republican candidates – Romney being a Mormon, McCain being 70 years old, and Giuliani’s very public divorces. Of these potential problems, McCain’s age is the biggest liability. When asked if they would be more or less likely to vote for McCain because he is 70, 1% said they would be more likely to vote for him, 19% would be more likely to vote against him, and 80% said that it would not make any difference or were unsure.

When asked about Giuliani’s divorces, 1% said they would be more likely to vote for Giuliani, 14% would be less likely to vote for him, and 86% said it would not make any difference or were unsure. Young voters and more religious voters are less likely to vote for Giuliani because of his divorces.

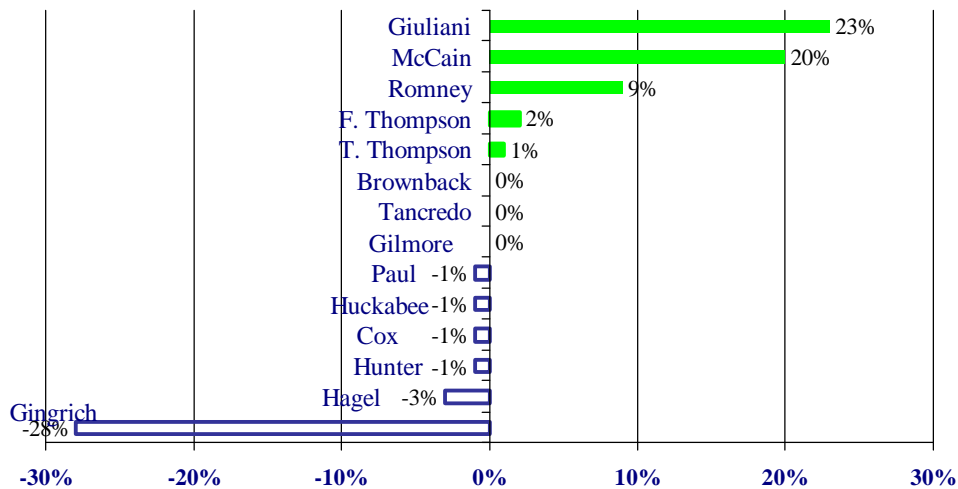
When asked about Romney being a Mormon, 3% said they would be more likely to vote for Romney, 10% would be less likely to vote for him, and 86% said it would not make any difference in their vote.

Least Popular Republican Candidate

Among likely Republican Primary voters, Gingrich is the least popular of the potential Republican candidates, named by 30%, followed by McCain (9%), Romney (8%), Giuliani (6%), Hagel (4%), Huckabee (2%), some other candidate (8%) while 33% are unsure.

Looking at the net popularity of potential Republican candidates – the percent who say he is their lest favorite candidate subtracted from the percent who say they will vote for him -- Giuliani is the most popular with a net popularity rating of +23%, followed by McCain (+20%), Romney (+9%), Fred Thompson (2%), Tommy Thompson (1%), Brownback (0%), Tancredo (0%), Gilmore (0%), Paul (-1%), Huckabee (-1%), Cox (-1%), Hunter (-1%), Hagel (-3%), and Gingrich (-28%).

Issues

The most important issue in the 2008 Presidential election to New Hampshire Republicans is the war in Iraq, named by 29%, followed by the economy (13%), health care (9%), foreign policy (6%), illegal immigration (5%), and homeland security (4%). When asked what the three most important issues are, 50% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by the economy (35%), health care (25%), foreign policy (17%), education (13%), illegal immigration (10%), and homeland security (8%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by CNN and WMUR-TV, Manchester. Three hundred six (306) likely 2008 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.3%) were interviewed between March 27 and April 3, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
