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NH GOP FIELD TIGHTENS, MOST REPUBLICANS YET TO DECIDE

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DURHAM, NH – Mitt Romney and Rudy Giuliani are tied for the lead in the New Hampshire Republican Primary. However, John McCain has bounced back among the leaders. Fred Thompson has not yet caught on in New Hampshire and has been hurt by his decision to skip the September 5 New Hampshire GOP debate. But most Republican voters have yet to decide who they will eventually vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred twenty-four (324) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between September 17 and September 24, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.4%.

Republican Primary

Former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney and former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani are tied for the lead among the Republican field in New Hampshire. Currently, 23% of likely Republican primary voters say they will vote for Romney, 22% say they will vote for Giuliani, 17% support Arizona Senator John McCain, and 12% prefer former Tennessee Senator and actor Fred Thompson.

Support for Romney has dropped 10 percentage points since the July Granite State Poll, an indication that his support has been soft. Giuliani is receiving about the same amount of the GOP vote that he has over the past two years. McCain has rebounded since his campaign shakeup in the early summer and has moved from 12% to 17%.

“Following his campaign shakeup, many in the media were saying John McCain was finished,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “But his decision to concentrate on New Hampshire has given his campaign a new spark.”

Among other Republican contenders, former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich is supported by 7% of likely Republican primary voters followed by Texas Congressman Ron Paul (4%), former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (2%), Kansas Senator Sam Brownback (2%), California Congressman Duncan Hunter (1%), and Colorado Congressman Tom Tancredo (1%) and 9% are undecided.

Thompson finally announced he was running in early September on the Jay Leno Show, but decided not to attend a Fox debate held earlier that day. This decision appears to be hurting his campaign in New Hampshire – 29% of likely primary voters say they are less likely to vote for Thompson because of this decision, 5% say they are more likely to vote for him, while 65 said it makes little difference.

When Newt Gingrich is dropped from the mix, there is little overall change in the race – Romney still leads (25%), followed by Giuliani (24%), McCain (18%), and Thompson (13%).

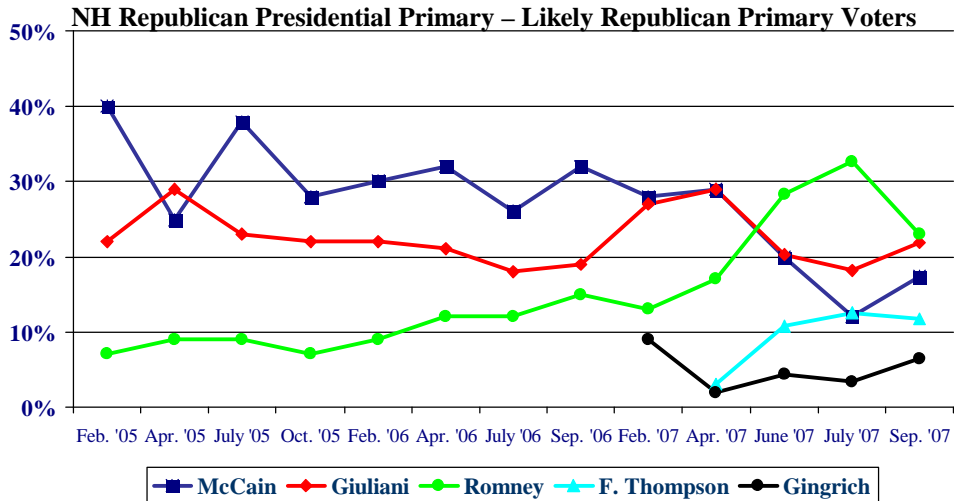
Giuliani does best among non-religious voters and 35 to 49 year olds. Romney does best among young voters (under 35) and voters who have moved to New Hampshire since 2002. McCain is strongest among voters with post-graduate educations.

It is important to note that the Republican race is far from over -- only 13% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 21% say they are leaning toward a candidate, and 66% say they are still trying to decide who to support.

“2008 may well be remembered as the most wide-open Republican presidential primary in New Hampshire history,” said Dante Scala, political science professor at the University of New Hampshire.

New Hampshire Republicans, as a whole, are not very satisfied with the Republican presidential field – only 19% say they are very satisfied with the Republican candidates, 62% are somewhat satisfied, 12% are not very satisfied, 5% are not satisfied at all, and 2% don’t know.



Undeclared Voter

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary, but two-thirds now say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. Currently, Romney holds a slim lead among undeclared voters with 26%, 22% prefer Giuliani, 17% for McCain, and 7% for Thompson.

Favorability Ratings

Giuliani is viewed most favorably by likely Republican Primary voters – 71% have a favorable opinion of Giuliani, 22% have an unfavorable opinion, 12% are neutral, and 1% don’t know enough about him to say. Giuliani’s net favorability rating – the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion -- is +49%. Giuliani’s net favorability rating has been slowly declining since last February when it stood at +56%. He gets his highest favorability ratings from young voters, new arrivals to New Hampshire, and those earning between \$75,000 and \$100,000.

Mitt Romney has decent, but not high favorability ratings – 65% of likely Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of Romney, 24% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral, and 3% don’t know enough to say. Romney’s net favorability rating is +41%, up from +33% in April. Romney gets his highest ratings from young voters (under 35), and residents of the New Hampshire seacoast.

John McCain’s favorability ratings are similar to Romney’s – 63% of likely Republican primary voters have a favorable opinion of McCain, 24% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 9% are neutral, and 4% don’t know enough about him to say. McCain’s net favorability rating is +39%, down from +50% in April.

Fred Thompson is less well known than the other major Republicans, only 47% have a favorable opinion of Thompson, 19% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 13% are neutral, and 21 % don’t know enough about him to sat. Thompson’s net favorability rating is +28%, up from +17% in April.

The other candidate’s inability to catch fire in New Hampshire can be seen in their net favorability ratings. Huckabee’s net favorability rating is +6%, Gingrich stands at only +3%, followed by Hunter (-3%), Tancredo (-4%), Brownback (-9%), and Paul (-19%).

Candidate Characteristics

Republicans think that Giuliani has the best chance of defeating the Democratic candidate in the 2008 general election – 32% think Giuliani has the best chance in the general election, 21% think Romney does, 13% name McCain, and 10% name Thompson.

Giuliani is also seen as the most likeable candidate – 29% of likely Republican primary voters say Giuliani is most likeable, 25% name Romney, 14% say McCain, and 13% cite Thompson.

Romney has recently run television ads positioning himself as an agent of change. When asked which candidate can bring needed change to the U.S., 25% name Romney, 18% cite Giuliani, and 13% name McCain.

McCain is seen as the candidate with the right experience to be President, named by 32%, 25% say Romney has the right experience, and 17% think Giuliani has the right experience.

Debates

As mentioned above, Thompson chose to skip a recent debate in New Hampshire and this act is not likely to have won him many voters in New Hampshire. New Hampshire Republicans believe that debates are important to determining who they will vote for – 27% say debates are very important to their vote decision, 46% say they are somewhat important, 18% say they are not very important, 8% say they are not important at all, and 1% don't know.

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred twenty-four (324) likely 2008 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.4%) were interviewed between September 17 and September 24, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
