ONE WEEK TO GO - ROMNEY & MCCAIN TIED IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – With less than one week to go before the New Hampshire Primary, Mitt Romney and John McCain are tied among likely Republican primary voters. But only one-third say they have definitely decided who they will support.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred thirty-nine (439) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 27 and December 30, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.7%.

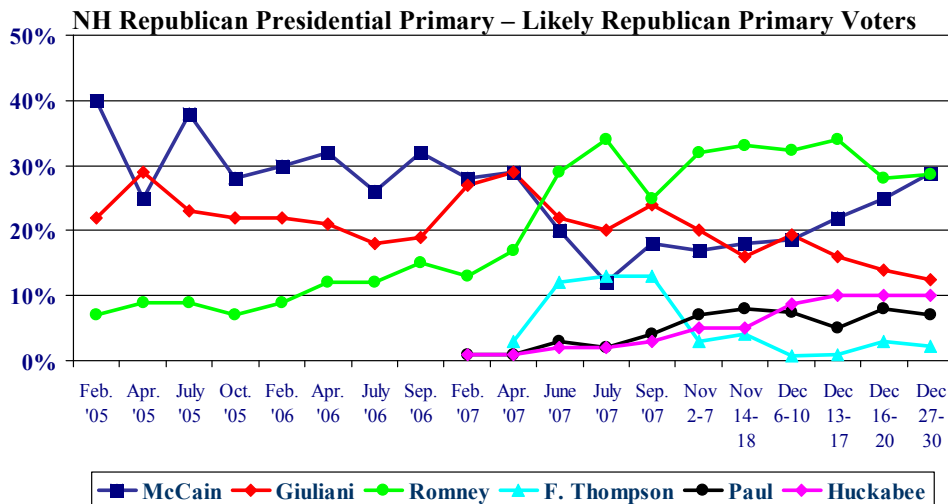
Republican Primary

With less than one week to go before the New Hampshire Primary, Arizona Senator John McCain and former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney are tied in the Republican primary race. Currently, 29% favor Romney, 29% favor McCain followed by former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani (12%), former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (10%), Texas Congressman Ron Paul (7%), former Tennessee Senator Fred Thompson (2%), California Congressman Duncan Hunter (2%), some other candidate (1%) and 8% are undecided.

McCain has steadily improved in recent weeks, largely at the expense of Giuliani, who is in danger of slipping into 4th or 5th place in New Hampshire. “Giuliani’s strategy of ignoring Iowa and New Hampshire looks to be backfiring,” said Andy Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “A fourth or fifth place finish in New Hampshire would be devastating to Giuliani’s campaign.”

But only one-third of likely Republican primary voters (33%) say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 29% are leaning toward a candidate, and 38% are still trying to make up their mind.

Romney gets his strongest support from young voters, upper income voters, and voters who are extremely interested in the primary. McCain gets his strongest support from Independents.

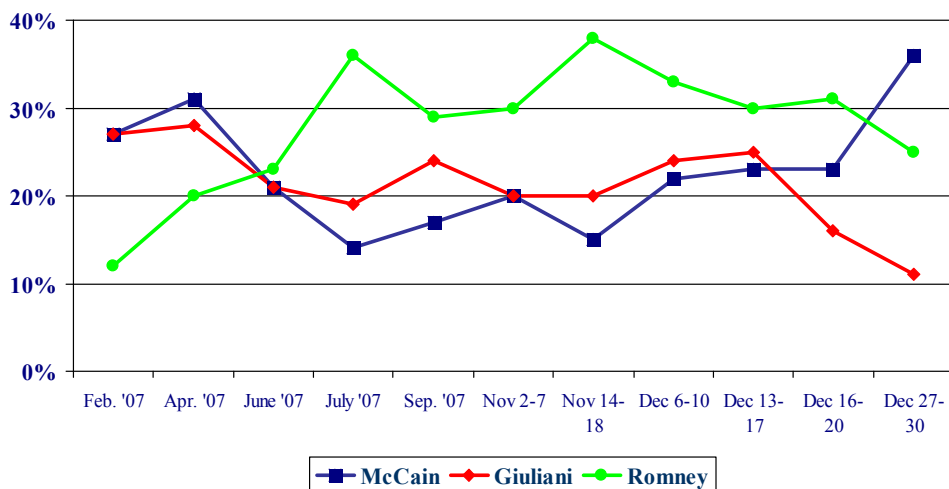


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Undeclared Voters

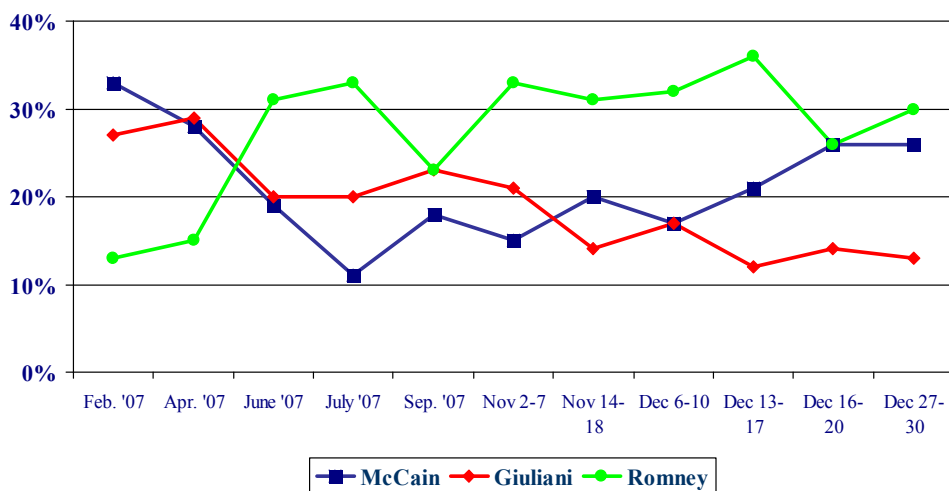
Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Currently, 63% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Republican primary, 36% say they plan to vote for McCain, 25% favor Romney, 12% favor Ron Paul, 11% favor Giuliani, and 8% favor Huckabee. McCain's support among undeclared voters has spiked in recent weeks as his campaign tries to recapture the magic of 2000 when he received 61% of the vote from undeclareds who voted in the Republican primary.

But 72% of the Republican primary electorate is currently made up of registered Republicans. Among registered Republicans, Romney is favored by 30%, McCain by 26%, followed by Giuliani (13%), Huckabee (11%) and Paul (5%).

Issues

On the major issues in the Republican nomination campaign, Romney leads in the eyes of likely Republican voters on domestic issues and McCain leads on foreign policy issues.

When asked which candidate is best able to handle the economy, 47% of likely Republican primary voters name Romney followed by McCain (14%), Giuliani (11%), Huckabee (5%) and Paul (5%). And when asked about illegal immigration, 35% say Romney is best able to handle that issue followed by Giuliani (21%), McCain (15%), Paul (7%), and Huckabee (5%).

But on the issue of the war in Iraq, 53% of Republican primary voters think McCain is best equipped to handle this issue followed by Romney (15%), Giuliani (12%), Paul (7%), and Huckabee (3%). And on the issue of terrorism, 43% think McCain is best able to handle it followed by Giuliani (31%), Romney (13%), Paul (3%) and Huckabee (2%). Giuliani has based much of his campaign on his ability to deal with terrorism and has led among Republican candidates on this issue. Falling behind McCain on this signature issue is further indication of Giuliani's troubles in New Hampshire.

Finally, Romney holds a narrow lead on the topic of abortion – 19% think Romney is best able to handle abortion, 14% name McCain followed by Giuliani (12%), Huckabee (11%), and Paul (7%). It is important to note that Huckabee, the Republican who most appeals to social conservatives, is far behind on this litmus test issue. This is due to the nature of the New Hampshire Republican electorate which is largely pro-choice on the abortion issue.

Candidate Qualities

Likely Republican primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Republican candidates. Romney has been leading the Republican field, in part, because he has been seen as the candidate best able to beat the Democratic candidate in November. Currently, 38% think Romney has the best chance of winning in November followed by McCain (25%), Giuliani (16%), Huckabee (4%) and Paul (2%). In New Hampshire, Giuliani is NOT seen as the most electable Republican.

Romney is also seen as the most likeable candidate – 25% name Romney followed by Giuliani (19%), Huckabee (19%), McCain (16%), and Paul (6%).

But McCain is now seen as the candidate with the right experience to be president, named by 40% of likely Republican primary voters, followed by Romney (27%), Giuliani (12%), Huckabee (5%) and Paul (3%).

McCain is also seen as the most honest candidate, named by 35% of Republicans, followed by Romney (21%), Huckabee (14%), Paul (10%), and Giuliani (4%).

Romney and McCain are equally viewed as the candidate who best represents voters like themselves, each named by 29% of likely Republican primary voters, followed by Huckabee (11%), Giuliani (11%), and Paul (7%).

Still Up In the Air

Only 39% of likely Republican primary voters say they have always supported their current candidate, 55% say they have always supported their current candidate, and 7% don't know. Among current Romney supporters who changed their minds, 29% said they used to support Giuliani and 26% used to support McCain. Among McCain supporters who changed their minds, 31% say they used to support Giuliani and 29% used to support Romney.

Most New Hampshire Republicans say they will finally decide who they will vote for between now and the primary – 29% say they will decide on election day, 16% say they will decide the final weekend, 15% will decide this week, and 38% say they have already decided who they will support. Almost half (48%) of Romney supporters say they have already decided they will vote for him compared to 41% of McCain supporters and 31% of Giuliani supporters.

This indecision is typical in New Hampshire. According to exit polls, in both 2000 and 2004, more than one-quarter of voters said they made up their minds who to vote for in the final weekend

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred thirty-nine (439) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between December 27 and December 30, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.7%. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
