### McCAIN GAINS, ROMNEY SLIPPING

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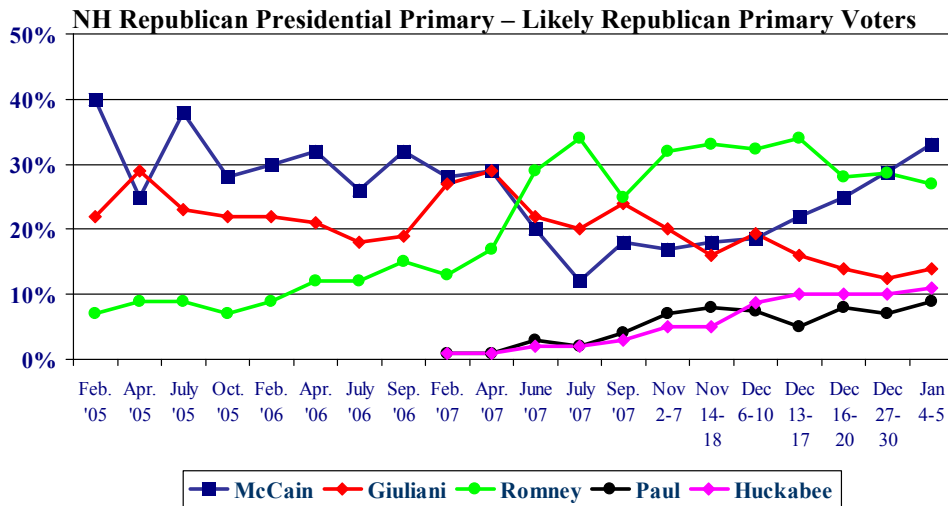
DURHAM, NH – John McCain continues to surge in New Hampshire while Mitt Romney has slipped into second.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Tracking Poll\*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred thirteen (313) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between January 4 and 3 p.m., January 5, 2008. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%.

With only days left until the New Hampshire Primary, Arizona Senator John McCain has overtaken former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney. Currently, 33% favor McCain, 27% favor Romney, followed by former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani (14%), former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (11%), Texas Congressman Ron Paul (9%), former Tennessee Senator Fred Thompson (1%), California Congressman Duncan Hunter (1%), some other candidate (2%) and 4% are undecided.

Romney appears to have been hurt somewhat by his loss to Huckabee in Iowa. However, there has been no Iowa “bounce” for Huckabee, who was at 10% in New Hampshire just before Iowa.

However, 44% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 29% are leaning toward a candidate, and 28% are still trying to make up their mind.

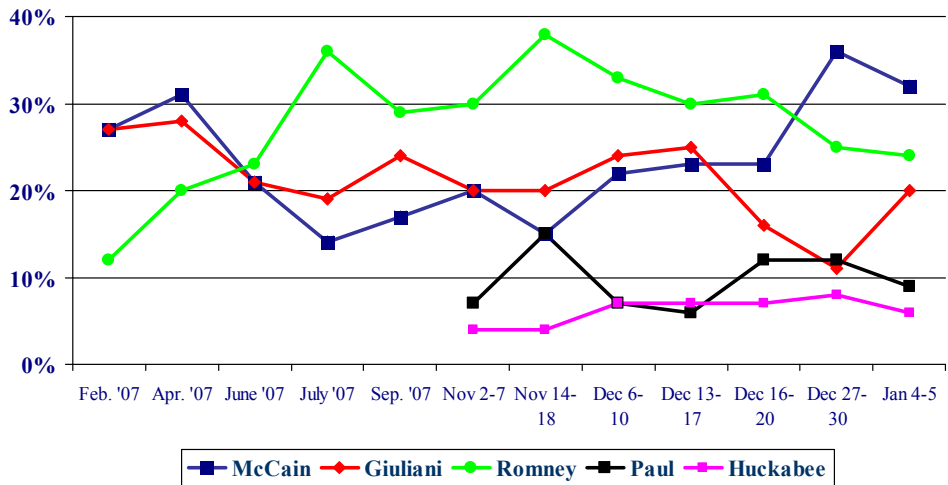

## Undeclared Voters

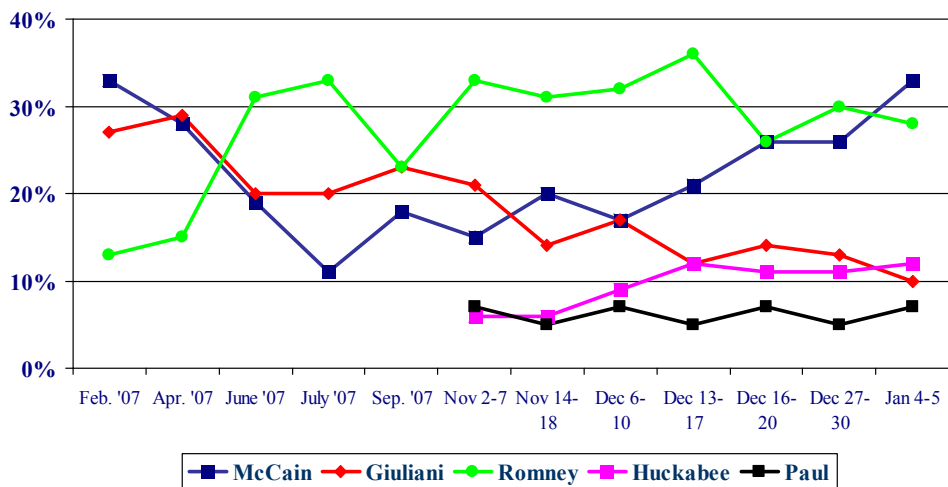
Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Currently, 56% of undeclared voters say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Republican primary, 32% say they plan to vote for McCain, 24% favor Romney, 20% favor Giuliani, 9% favor Paul, and 6% favor Huckabee. Despite targeting undeclared voters, McCain has not capitalized on Romney's loss in Iowa among this group. Rather, Giuliani has pulled some of them back into his camp.

But according to this latest poll, 63% of the Republican primary electorate is made up of registered Republicans. Among registered Republicans, McCain also leads Romney. Thirty-three percent of registered Republicans favor McCain, 28% favor Romney, 14% prefer Huckabee, 10% favor Giuliani, and 8% favor Paul.

## Favorability Ratings

One reason McCain has pulled ahead in the Republican race is that he is viewed more favorably than his rivals. Eighty-one percent have a favorable opinion of McCain, 13% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5% are neutral, and 1% don't know. His net favorability rating, the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percent with an unfavorable opinion, is +68%.

Sixty-five percent have a favorable opinion of Romney, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 8% are neutral. Romney's net favorability rating is only +37%.

Fifty-seven percent have a favorable opinion of Huckabee, 25% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12% are neutral, and 6% are not sure. Huckabee's net favorability rating is +32%.

Sixty-three percent have a favorable opinion of Giuliani, 33% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 4% are neutral, and 1% are not sure. Giuliani's net favorability rating is +30%.

### **Candidate Qualities**

Likely Republican primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Republican candidates. Romney has been leading the Republican field, in part, because he has been seen as the candidate best able to beat the Democratic candidate in November. But he now trails McCain on this measure after his loss in Iowa. Currently, 29% think McCain has the best chance of winning in November followed by Romney (28%), Giuliani (16%), Huckabee (7%) and Paul (3%).

McCain is also seen as the candidate with the right experience to be president, named by 40% of likely Republican primary voters, followed by Romney (25%), Giuliani (14%), Huckabee (6%) and Paul (6%).

McCain (31%) is viewed as the candidate who best represents voters like themselves, followed by Romney (26%), Giuliani (13%), Huckabee (12%), and Paul (9%).

Romney and McCain tied as the candidate best able to bring needed change to the U.S., each named by 23% of likely Republican primary voters, followed by Giuliani (14%), Paul (14%), and Huckabee (13%).

Finally, McCain is seen as the most inspiring candidate, named by 29% of Republicans, followed by Romney (17%), Giuliani (17%), Huckabee (16%), and Paul (9%).

### **A Mormon for President?**

The issue of religion has recently factored into the Republican race. When asked if the country is ready to elect a Mormon president, 65% said the country is ready, 21% think the country is not ready, and 14% are not sure. Giuliani supporters are most likely to say the country is not ready to elect a Mormon.

### **CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology**

The **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Tracking Poll** is conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred thirteen (313) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between January 4 to 3 p.m. January 5, 2008. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5%. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
