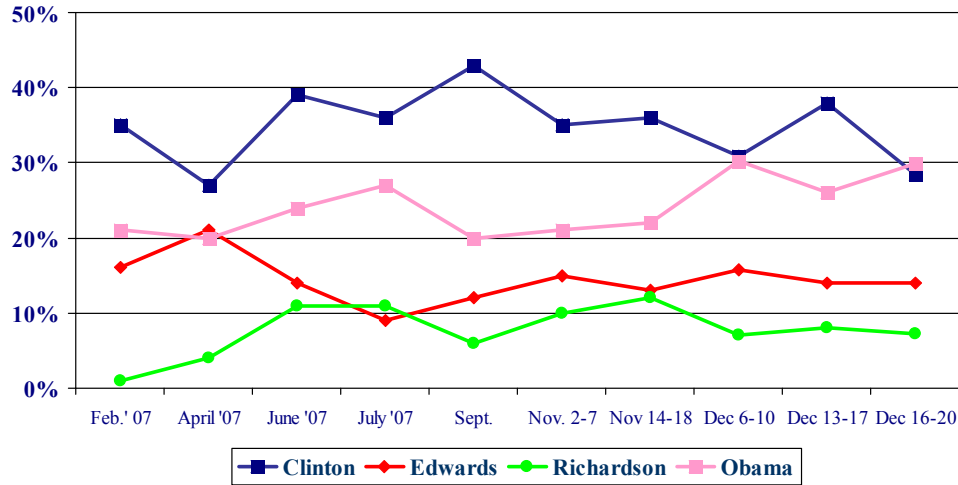

NH Democratic Presidential Primary – Likely Democratic Primary Voters

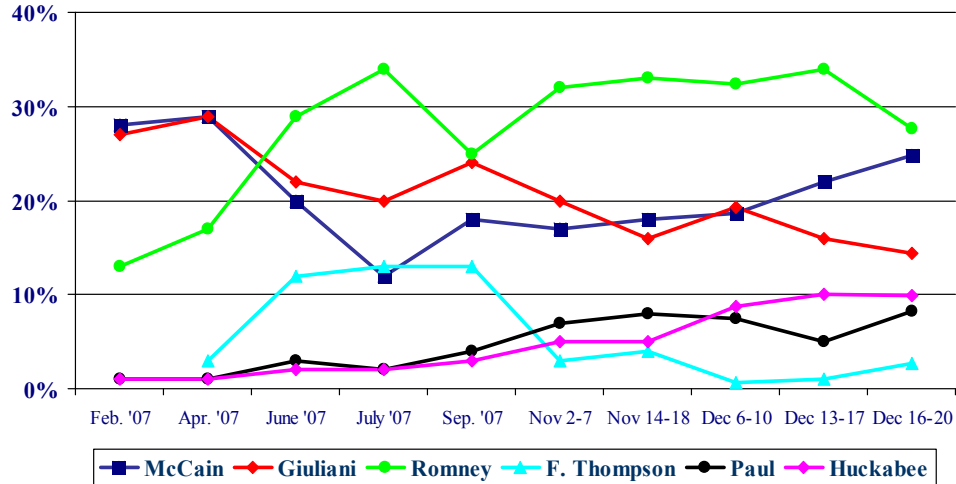
