PSYCHOLOGY COURSE"**

Dear Colleagues:

The University of New Hampshire (UNH) will be offering our GRAD 980 course (Preparing to Teach a Psychology Course) for the 9th consecutive year. This two-credit online graduate course will be offered by distinguished faculty (listed on website) **from June 1 to July 23, 2010** (offered asynchronously via *Blackboard*©).

Students who completed the course in past years have come from universities and colleges from across the United States and Puerto Rico as well as from nearly a dozen other countries (e.g., Canada, Chile, England, France, Ireland, Mexico, Northern Ireland, Russia, Scotland). Since 2002, enrollees in the course have come from over 85 different institutions, including private, public, research universities, comprehensive universities, liberal arts colleges, and community colleges. Course Description

Preparation for teaching in Psychology. Examination of issues and models involving course design and interaction with students. Products from the course will include a complete course syllabus, a statement of teaching philosophy, and the first teaching module of a course.

WE WILL ONCE AGAIN OFFER OUR "2 FOR 1" TUITION/FEE MATCH. If your institution pays for the cost of enrollment of one student, UNH will cover the cost of enrollment for a second student (for as long as we have remaining matching funds). We have only limited funds for tuition/fee matches, so if you are in a position to take advantage of this offer, please note that it will be "first come, first served." As in the past,

we will have funding from the American Psychological Association Education Directorate to use for tuition/fee matches.

If the "2 for 1" registration model does not apply to someone's circumstances, he/she may pay for enrollment in GRAD 980 from his/her own or employer's funds.

The total tuition and fee for the course for non-New Hampshire residents will be \$834.75 in US dollars (tuition = \$ 784; registration fee = \$35; technology fee = \$15.75).

If you want your institution to be considered for the “2 for 1” tuition match offer, please indicate that in a reply sent directly to me. Be sure to include the names and email addresses of the students. I will then follow up with the students and instruct them on how to complete the registration process. The tuition match offers will be allocated quickly, so reply soon if you want to be considered. Once the matches have been allocated, students may still register and pay for the course until the enrollment cap is reached.
