Summary

Research at the intersection of business, technology, and society involves the development and application of statistical and machine learning models to collect and analyze large-scale data for causal problem solving. Of particular interest are (1) the societal implications of digital platforms and markets (a.k.a. multisided platforms, sharing economy, peer-to-peer markets), and (2) how emerging information technologies and tools such as big data analytics and artificial intelligence affect decision making in organizations and society at large.
