In compliance with Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act” or the “Act”), Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), the University of New Hampshire releases the following information regarding the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting—Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students for the quarter ended September 30, 2021:

1. The University of New Hampshire acknowledges the institution has signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education (“Department”), the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. The University of New Hampshire will receive up to \$15,177,513 from the Department pursuant to the institution’s Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.
3. The University of New Hampshire distributed \$5,619,000 of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs during the quarter July 1, 2021 - September 30, 2021.
4. The University of New Hampshire determined that 16,273 students at the institution were eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs during the quarter July 1, 2021 - September 30, 2021.
5. The University of New Hampshire has distributed Emergency Financial Aid Grants to 6,922 students under CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs, during the quarter July 1, 2021 - September 30, 2021.
6. The University of New Hampshire used enrollment in a degree program and demonstrated need that was disclosed on the students’ FAFSA to determine which students and how much each student receives under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.
7. The University of New Hampshire made an application available to each qualifying student to determine if the students were affected by the COVID-19 outbreak. E-mail communications with application instructions were sent to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
