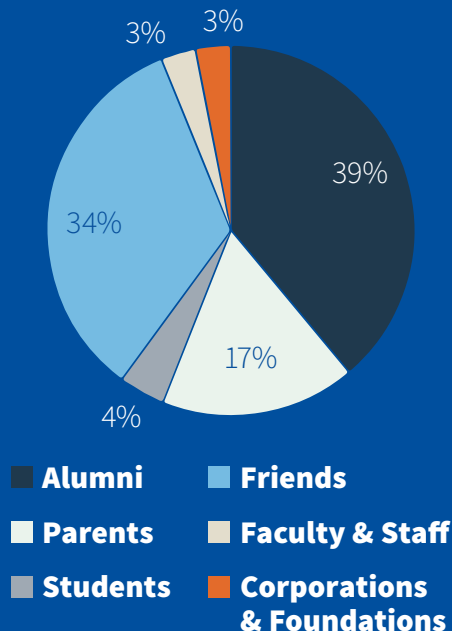

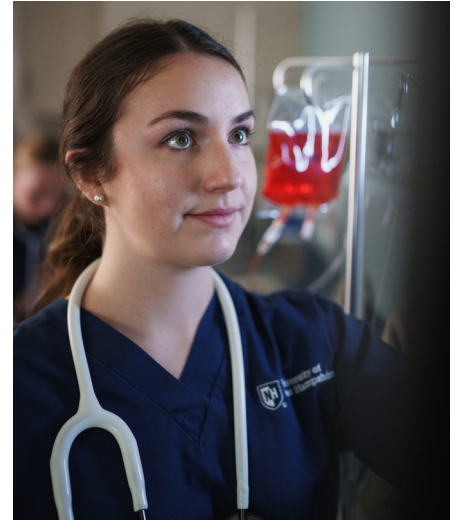
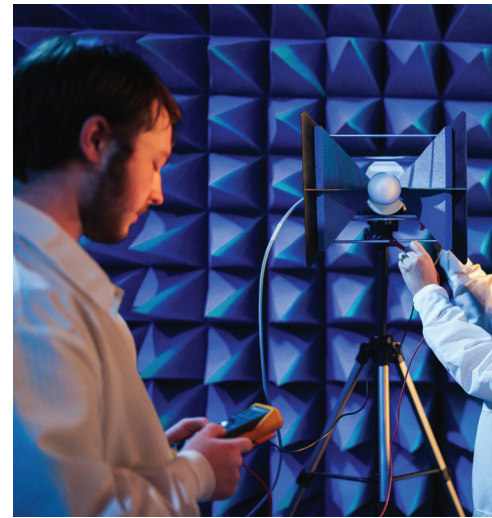
## Noteworthy Impacts

-  **834** projects were worked on in the CEPS Makerspace using 3-D printers, laser cutters, soldering and more.
-  The UNH Library's new scanner translates to over **100 languages** to help grow Inter-Library Loans and digitization.
-  All **10 counties** in New Hampshire were represented at this year's 4-H Teen Conference.
-  **25 interns** spearheaded sustainability projects such as the Cat Trax Bike Share.
-  **20** UNH Manchester students received financial assistance for books, supplies and other essential course materials.
-  The Women in Business Conference welcomed over **200 attendees** to network and discuss collaborative leadership.
-  **30 students** began their leadership journeys by participating in LEAD UNH's annual retreat.



## Hands-On Opportunities

Game-changing **chances to learn and work in real-world settings** are a hallmark of the UNH experience, and gifts open so many of these doors. They sent COLA students to national civic organizations like the U.S. Department of Education and various congressional and senate offices, and Paul students to multinational corporations like Amazon, Pepsi Co. and more. They allowed dozens of UNH Franklin Pierce law students to complete public interest placements and helped students foster a greater understanding of equity and inclusion on campus.





## On Campus and in the Community

Donor support **makes a difference in all corners of UNH's three campuses and across the Granite State.**

Gifts helped the women's soccer team analyze key performance data and the football team return to campus early for training. They also provided wilderness first-aid training for COLSA faculty, staff and graduate students and funded two UNH Extension interns who worked with local farmers to address plant diseases and the impact of inflation. Additionally, gifts paved the way for more than 85 athletes with disabilities to compete in a variety of sports through Northeast Passage.

## Access to Support

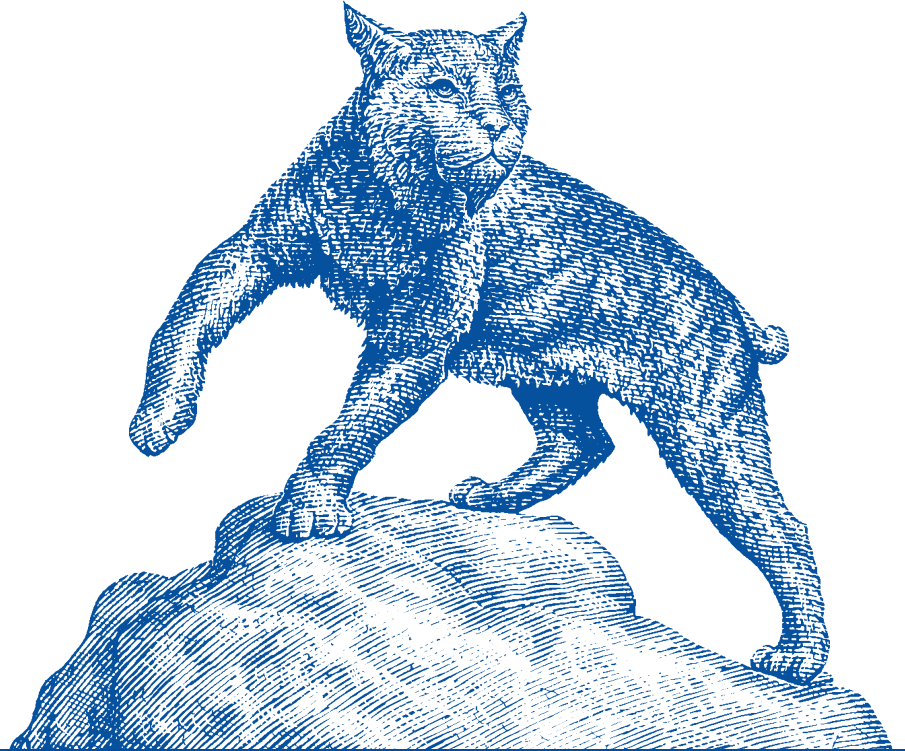
Donor generosity **creates and enhances the UNH student experience.** The CEPS Mathematics Center provided tutoring and study resources to more than 750 students, CHHS student interns received funding for travel and housing expenses and new state-of-the-art equipment helped COLA students create detailed 3D models of ancient Roman buildings. Physical upgrades were made to the Shoals Marine Lab and the Beaugard Center to better serve their communities and the Graduate School hosted professional development events that benefited more than 1,300 students.
