About the Vaccine

The vaccine is recommended for the prevention of genital warts in males.

Males

Females should receive the vaccine even if they have had a history of cervical dysplasia or abnormal pap smears that have been evaluated or treated. It does NOT protect against all types of HPV and Pap smears are still needed. Health Services provides annual gynecological exams and Pap smears. If a student has paid the health fee, gynecological exams are available at no cost. The cost for a Pap smear is \$15.

Females

The HPV vaccine (Gardasil) is recommended for females and males ages 9 – 26. Ideally, the vaccine is given to individuals who have not become sexually active, BUT it is still recommended once sexually active.
