



CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE AND EFFECTIVE STEM TEACHING (CREST): A NOYCE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

The CREST Program, a Noyce Scholarship Program, funded by the National Science Foundation, brings together the UNH Education Department and the programs offering STEM disciplines (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) to enhance the quantity and quality of STEM teachers in middle schools and high schools. The Program offers up to \$15,000 in annual scholarships for undergraduates and up to \$18,500 for graduate students to encourage them to enter STEM education careers in high-needs districts.

Qualifications:

- Be a STEM discipline major or currently hold a bachelor's degree in a STEM field.
- Must be at least a second semester sophomore at time of application (57 credits earned or in process).
- It is preferred that applicants have completed or be enrolled in Education 500/935 at the time of application. Applicants may be able to waive this qualification by completing the *Successful Experience with Children Verification* form included with this application packet.
- Students applying for scholarships to cover graduate education must also apply for admission to the graduate program in Education by February 1.

Requirements following receipt of funds:

- For each year of funding received, program participants must teach in a highneed school district for two years following graduation. In addition to the long list of qualifying schools provided at https://www.tcli.ed.gov/CBSWebApp/tcli/TCLIPubSchoolSearch.jsp, graduates may also teach in districts where STEM disciplines are in critical shortage. Failure to uphold this teaching requirement results in the scholarship converting into a repayable loan.
- Scholarship recipients must participate in professional development activities including guest speakers, an annual conference, online mentorship, etc.
- Recipients must complete a master's degree in education through the UNH Education Department.
- Scholarship recipients must agree to provide tracking data until completion of program and teaching requirement (including changes in address/email address and annual proof of employment as a STEM teacher).
- Recipients must agree to be part of programmatic evaluation on teacher development until all requirements of the program are met, including surveys and focus group participation regarding their growth and capacity as teachers.

- Completed and signed application form.
- Official transcripts for all undergraduate credits earned. Current UNH students may submit unofficial transcripts.
- Essay of 200-500 words.
- Three letters of recommendation (at least one addressing academic work and at least one addressing work with children or youth). These letters should be emailed or mailed directly to the Leitzel Center by your recommenders.
- Successful Experience with Children/Youth Verification Form (only for applicants who have not taken EDUC 500 or 935).

- Notify the Noyce Program administrators if I withdraw from UNH or change my personal contact information.

- Teach a STEM discipline in grades 5-12 within a high-needs school district for two years for each year of financial support received from the CREST Noyce Program. Failure to complete the teaching requirement within eight years after completing the program will necessitate that I repay UNH the amount of my Noyce support and any additional interest and fees, as described in the Program's promissory note. For each year of teaching, I am responsible for submitting proof of completion to the Noyce Program administrators within 30 days of the end of the school year.
- The scholarship is for one year only and, though likely to be continued given satisfactory academic progress, there is no implied commitment after the first year.
