



## **Postdoctoral Scholar in Stratification**

### **College of Liberal Arts**

**Department:** Sociology

**Description:** The Department of Sociology seeks a postdoctoral fellow to conduct research in the area of stratification, broadly defined. We are particularly interested in stratification research that applies cutting-edge methods and approaches, as well as research that overlaps with and builds upon existing areas of departmental strength such as rural migration, gender and work, community and environment, and youth victimization.

The Scholar's 2-year appointment would aim to facilitate the production of grant applications, the collection and analysis of original data, and the publication of peer-reviewed articles in high-impact journals. The ideal candidate would collaborate with and mentor graduate students in our Master's and Doctoral Programs, while simultaneously benefiting from the mentorship of senior faculty in the UNH Sociology Department, the Carsey School of Public Policy, and/or the Crimes against Children Research Center, all of which are located on the same campus. Throughout the 2-year appointment, the Scholar will present on-going research to faculty and graduate students in the Sociology Department's annual colloquium series, teach one course per year, and contribute to an on-going revision of the Sociology curriculum at the undergraduate and graduate levels.
