

FACULTY SENATE MOTION II-M4
ON ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

Date: November 10, 1997

Text of Motion:

Motion that the Faculty Senate action on May 12, 1997, recommending that the provost take no further action regarding "articulation agreements with New Hampshire Technical and Community Colleges" be rescinded and that the provost utilize the existing approval processes for the transfer of credit.

Rationale:

The Academic Affairs Committee was charged with studying the issue of transfer of credits from the New Hampshire Technical and Community Colleges as they move from one accrediting commission to another. The Committee has met with the Provost on two occasions and once with Gary Cilley from the Admissions Office. We believe that the restriction should be lifted and that the Provost should continue to use the established practice of reviewing requests for transfer by circulating them to the appropriate academic department or General Education Committee. This is a return to the status quo and not a new approval structure. The faculty retains its authority over curricular matters including transfer of credits.
