McNair Current Stats

Since the UNH McNair Scholars Program began in 1991, it has served **350** students. Of those, **150** alumni have gone on to receive a master's degree and **35** have earned a PhD degree. **18** alumni have gone on to earn other professional doctorates and **22** alumni are currently in a graduate program.

There are currently **32** UNH McNair Scholars enrolled in the program and **21**Pre-McNair students are currently on their way to become McNair Scholars next year!

McNair Alumni Spotlight
