5. WHERE do I stay?

Spring Reunion 2026

On-Campus: Stay close to the heart of reunion festivities by reserving a room in Adams Tower West (formerly the New England Center). *Register for on-campus housing when you register for reunion weekend.*

Off-campus: Off-campus reservations are booked by the individual.

Fall Reunion 2026

Local hotels or guest houses only; no on-campus housing options available.

6. How do I register?

Spring Reunion 2026

Registration opens in March 2026.

Fall Reunion 2026

Registration will open in late summer 2026.

7. Are walk-ins accepted?

Pre-registration is appreciated. **Walk-in availability is limited** at events requiring a registration fee. All walk-ins must first register at the Elliott Alumni Center to confirm availability and pay related event fees. Check the schedule for registration hours and fees.

8. How much is it to attend reunion?

Many spring reunion events are free, however if food and beverages will be served there may be an associated cost. **Pricing will be available in March 2026.**

9. How can I find out if my friends are going?

Once registration is open you can search the attendee list on the reunion homepage. **Be sure to reach out to your friends to encourage them to attend!**

10. Dietary restrictions or handicap accessibility requirements:

UNH is committed to making your reunion experience as comfortable as possible. Please note any specific needs on your registration form, and we will do our best to accommodate them. Our
